INOCULATION OF CHILDREN ASKED

Doctors Join With County and City in Fight to Halt Typhoid

With the state's promise to provide a quantity of serum, physicians of Kimberly, Twin Falls, along with Twin Falls county and city officials, last night formulated plans for inoculation of school children in an effort to curb further spread of typhoid fever in Twin Falls county.

Decision to inoculate all children who have their parents' consent was reached at a meeting in the probate court room of Twin Falls county court house last night.

Doctors present at the meeting were Dr. C. D. Weaver, Dr. William P. Packer and Dr. Charles E. Wagner, county health officer, and Dr. A. L. Klotz, assistant state bacteriologist, and decided that the doctors would conduct the inoculations in their own offices.

Requests for permission to inoculate the children will be sent to parents—will-student—either city or rural schools of the county and records will be kept by the school nurse.

Last night's meeting came as the result of a session earlier in the week when the county health officer, appeared before the officials and after declaring the situation "serious" offered the plan to the county, free of charge.

Leonard also made an appeal to city and county officials which brought about immediate action.

Before the day was over the county commissioners had set aside a fund with which to move all residents of the county "ten camps" in Twin Falls city limits, to a temporary site near the county poor farm. The county also is making an effort to clean up several cases of the fever known to exist just outside the limits of Twin Falls.

Warne Haskells, the commissioners also sent out a warning to all residents of the county to either chlorinate or boil all ditch water used.

The city government yesterday started out a campaign to insure proper coverage of all garbage cans within the city limits and Mayor Duncan McD. Johnson introduced legislation which will make property owners responsible for all unsanitary conditions on their property.

Heading the campaign to secure parents' permission for child inoculation is Mrs. Elizabeth Smith, city school nurse, and Miss E. Le Flang, district supervisor of nurses for the I.S.D.
