

The truth in Mr. Alc. Grady's remark can be taken to apply to a great deal more than the soft coal strike. Sometimes the hope is great, as in the coal strike in which all three sides, the miners, the operators, and the government-represented public, realize the cost to themselves of each day's continuation of the walk-out. But in every case of arbitration, there is some degree of hope.

Persons were once adjudged innocent or guilty by the result of personal combat. Lat-er, they solved their differences by fighting duels. Nowadays, it sooms silly to attempt to determine questions of fact or to solve the problems of individuals by the irrelevant use of force, skill, or luck, when it is possible to review logically the matters having a true bearing on the situation. Perhaps someday it will seem as silly to try to solve the differ-ences between nations and industrial groups by the use of force.
