In driving one hundred twenty five miles through a soft coal area in one of the mid-western states, a newspaper man passed more that one hundred trucks hauling-coal-to neighboring cities and towns. This coal was mostly from small mines operated on an amateur or bootleg basis, and he noticed eral small mines opened along the road-

Here is one of the things that have upset Here is one of the filings that have upset the coal industry and resulted in the enact-ment of the Guffey coal-stabilization bill about which there is now so much debate. Here, too, is individual enterprise work-ing in the old-fashioned American way. It might be supposed that farmers would have a perfect right to mine coal veins on their property and truckers would have a

have a perfect right to mine con veins on their_proporty, and truckers_would-have_a perfect right to haul it away and sell it for whatever it would bring. This means old fashloned property rights, competition and individual enterprise. Yet the federal gov-

individual enterprise. Yet the federal government undertakes to set up arbitrary control of outputrandomany of the towns in that region are trying to have ordinances passed problibiling use of the streets to truckers hauling direct from the mines.

The trouble is that a great industry is demoralized by unlimited production and distribution. Coal investments no longer pay profits, coal mining is irregular, miners cannot get living wages, railronds in the coal areas lose business, and business interests of many kinds depending on the coal industry of many kinds depending on the coal industry

So we come into what a business comment-ator calls "the twilight zone of managed economics." It is a regrettable situation to most Americans. But to questions and critiems the inevitable answer is, "What are or going to do? Do we want chaos or order

Walter Millis, whose gently cyntenl account of the war with Spain provided amusing reading a few years ago, has come out. with another "debunking." Inhiory, this time of the World war.

But the Ironically tolerant attitude which marked the first book is wholly logding from this latest production. It is rather a philipple in which Millis expresses the thesis that virtually everybody in the world from the theis that virtually everybody in the world from 1905 to the prezent date has been extremely dumb. His particular villains, or rather clowns, are, however, President Wilson and Colonel House, whose corrously President Wilson and Colonel House, whose "curiously-inept diplomacy" made American entry into the World

With the major premise of the book there can be little quarte. The premise is that events are greater than men; that men are caught in the swirling tides of variable understood forces, and do not and cannot control that greater. control these forces.

It is, he argues, precisely because statesmen flatter It is, no signes, precessly occasion anaecomer instead of recognizing their helpirapeas in the face of imme-morial historic forces, that such tragedies as the World war are not only passible but almost lineritable. Incidentally-the author does a fine job, of furbishing up the somewhat tarnished reputation of William Jennings Bryan as secretary of state. Bryan, he contends, was the only man who took a same stand on American neutrality in the whole administration; and even he took it by instinct, not because he knew what it was all about.






