

JOHN BULL'S BIG STICK

The most significant fact in the international news lately has been the demon stration of the power of Great Britain. Any one who supposed that John Bull had one foot in the grave and his empire-was falling to pieces had a sudden awakening. At the moment when it looked as if a new Caesar was knocking the keystone out of the imold Roman Empire, the ruling statesmen in-London took hold and-struck. They mobilized in the Mediterranean a

fleet powerful enough to blow Italy out of the water—a fleet compared with which the conquerors of the Spanish Armada and Trafalgar, were children's toys on a park nond They swung powerful armies to the defense of Egypt and the Soudan. They-took hold of the supposedly neutral Suez Canal, controlling Italy's sea route to Abyssinia. They assumed leadership at Geneva and lined up the League of Nations against Italy. They reached out a thousand hands to tighten the world's purse strings and shut off Italian war supplies. They showed Great Britain war suppness. They showed great Britain and her Dominions, after all-their pacified talk, as ready as ever to fight for their threatened interests. Nearly all of this, it may be remarked, was done not frankly in defense of British

Interests but as a magnificent gesture for world peace. It is a way Anglo-Saxons have;
they must give a moral reason for a practical deed In this case, however, the two
motives amount to about the same thing, so far as world interests and American inter

DRIVING DAMAGES

Wisconsin has a new-law to compel pay-ment of damages awarded to victims of auto-mobile-accidents. If drivers against whom damages have been assessed by the courts have not paid by the time for license re-newal, they will be denied new licenses. The rule applies to property damages up to one thousand dollars and injury or death liabil-ity up to five thousand dollars for one person or ten thousand dollars for more than one.

This requirement may work hardship in some cases yet seems fair enough when everything is considered.

A better way still would be to establish

an insurance system that automatically pro-fected accident victims-by-granting-no-driv-ing licenses without evidence of security for a reasonable liability.

HARDER RUSSIAN DIVORCE

The Russian government is tightening up. its divorce laws. The first thing to be changed is the "postcard system," under which a bored husband or wife could go to a marriage and divorce bureau, ask for a divorce pay three rubles and depart free of a spouse. The divorced partner learned of the incl-

dent only when a notice arrived by mail.

The new law recognizes the "right of either party to obtain a divorce" but provides that official registration can be obtained only with the knowledge of both parties. It pro-vides—also for—withholding—alimony_allot-ments from the salary of a divorced parent, and for notifying the proper authorities if the place of employment is changed or wages are increased. The government is getting
