

On the word of Secretary Wallace the notate control bill will not be enforced, a

potato control bill will not be enforced, at least the Secretary says he is going to do all he-can-to-avoid-enforcing it.

For one thing, no funds are available for its enforcement but it is a question if the Secretary, would have been willing to accept responsibility for such enforcement even if there had been-

The potato control bill is perhaps the best example of crop curtailment so far attempted. At the time the cotton control bill was passed the assurance was given that cotton was to be the only crop so regulated. But cotton belt farmers were not willing to allow

their land to lie idle and so they planted it, the market of increased peanut production

it became necessary to regulate the growing of this crop. Tobacco control followed.

Such a programme necessarily cannot be confined to any one crop. If one is to be regulated all must be or the entire machinery of agricultural production is thrown out- of large of the programme of the programme of the production of the programme of the program balance. It may become absolutely necessary to regulate potato production notwithstand-ing Mr. Wallace's determination to set aside the law which was passed as a part of his own programme and which it is his sworn






