



It will be unfortunate if Great Britain ar argument about warships. A row on this subis unnecessary. Our navies for a dozen years, placed on an even footing by the Washington Treaty, have not been competitive. Calm Americans will find it hard to see why they should be competitive now. It is easier to imagine them supplementing each other, as a moral power for peace, than fighting

Such thoughts are aroused by the recenexchange of messages between Washington and London on this subject. The United States happens to be building quite a few new warships of various classes. These, our government explains, are intended merely to bring us up to the strength permitted for both America and Britain in existing

These treaties are still in force for another year, although Japan, having "de-nounced"—them, seems to consider herself nounced—them, seems to consider nersell free already to build beyond the ratio assaigned her. Britain, apparently, also wants to go ahead enlarging her navy on the assumption that the Washington and London treaties are scrapped. Uncle Sam mildly sug-gests that they are not scrapped.

Britain is alarmed by the European situation and feels the need of more warships.
Yet she seems, from this distance, to have plenty of sea power to handle Italy and any

her nation likely to make trouble for her. If she builds beyond the equal tonnage allowed, our government will naturally feel






