TRAGIC WEEK-END

Last week-end was a tragic one in the annals of transportation by air. Twelve perannais or transportation by air. I were per-sons complishing the crow and passengers of a cross country air liner lost their lives in a crash a few miles east of Cheyenne while somewhere in the wiles of Utah or Newada. A second ship is down and no trace of ship occupants has so far been found.

As long as planes fly accidents will occur.

Circumstances will arise over which the pilot has no control, yet because of the spec-facular nature of airplane accidents the pub-lic is all too prone to forget the thousands upon thousands of miles flown in perfect asfety and with a minimum of discomfort of any kind to passengers.

The accident record in the business of air transportation grows steadily better. Time was when any pilot had only to continue in

the business long enough to ensure death.

This was in the early days of flying when
the heavier than air machine was in its infancy; when little scientific knowledge of the subject obtained and when safety appli-ances of all kinds now in everyday use were absolutely unknown.

Flying is today almost as well established ns any other form of transportation and if exact figures could be obtained it would probably be found that there are no greater risks attached to it than to the business of driv-ing an automobile. But automobile accidents have become of such common occurence as to attract little attention while an air acci-dent because of its very nature is invariably

In the case of the Chevenne crash there are features which seem to lend an air of mystery to the occurrence which may never be penetrated. So, too, in the other case re-ferred to. An investigation of a plane crash does not always tell a complete story but little by little the risk factor is being steadily reduced and air transportation, in spite of ceidents, continues to grow in popularity.

ACCIDENT

George Byard of Kimberly, under the care of physicians at Boyle's ranch in the Loon Greek country, appears to have been the vic-tim of one of the most extraordinary hunt-ing accidents on record. Happily the young man has a very good chance of recovery ac-cording to word reaching Twin Falls not-withstanding the fact that the bullet passed completely through his body and lodged in A majority of the cases of the wounding

of hunters during the deer season come about by reason of the willingness of some hunters to shoot at anything that moves while in the woods. A rustle in the brush, the movement of a limb or even an unusual noise offer sufficient excuse for the speeding of a bullet in the general direction of

disturbance. All too often some hapless hunter is brought low.

Nothing of this kind took place in the

case of young Byard. The shot which struck him was fired from a point over a mile nway at a deer which happened to cross the of fire between the hunter and the vic tim. Neither man was in sight of the other, probably neither knew the other was any-where within rifle shot The entire circumstance was as purely accidental as any such happening could be. No question of carelessness is involved, no violation of any of the rules of hunting. The chances of such an accident occurring are probably less than one in ten thousand. So far as known no such case has ever occurred before in South-
