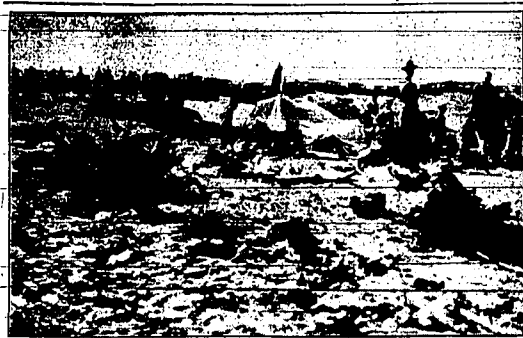

### MODIFIED POTATO ACT RECOMMENDED

#### Producers' Committee Urges Enforcement for Next Allotment Year

WASHINGTON, Oct. 8 (AP)—Sharp modifications of the law control potato law was recommended to the AAA yesterday by a producers' committee.

The committee, however, urged enforcement of the act as it stands for the next allotment year beginning December 1, 1936.

The potato program development committee, headed by B. D. Areas of Moscow, Va., requested Secretary Wallace to ask congress in January for these five amendments to the control law:

Increase of automatic allotment exemption from five to 50 bushels. Provisions for a referendum with approval of 2/3 of producers entitled to an allotment necessary for continuance of control after first year.

Provision to exempt specifically the consumer from penalties with reference to stamping and packing the potatoes.

Provisions for growers who sell direct to the consumer to file return on sales to eliminate attaching stamps to potatoes. Provisions for regulation of shipment of potatoes in interstate commerce in excess of grower allotments.

#### Suggest Referendum

In addition, the committee suggested that a referendum be held to obtain sentiment of growers to avoid enforcement of the law during the allotment year. The committee suggested that this referendum to be held after state allotments were made and regulations issued, need not be binding on the secretary but might aid in enforcing the law.

Members of the committee, the AAA, were advised by growers representing the important commercial potato states at a meeting here which was presided over by the committee was dissatisfied, but it was indicated that the recommendations were somewhat in line with proposals which have been expressed by AAA officials. Secretary Wallace said recently that it might be necessary to ask congress to modify the law.

### IRRIGATION DISTRICT TO PAY CONSTRUCTION

BURLEY, Oct. 8.—Construction charges of \$1.55 per acre fixed by the bureau of reclamation will be paid out of poorer profits of the Burley Irrigation district, according to announcement made by Manager Hugh Crawford, Tuesday.

One half of the annual payment of approximately \$50,000 will fall due in December, plus about \$750 which the district will pay on 5000 acres belonging to non-consenters, bringing the total cost to the district to about \$51,000.

The balance of the non-consenters' charges in excess of \$1.55 per acre must be paid by the land owners who have not agreed to the new contract and who will complete their final payment of construction costs this year.

Water will run until November 10, directors stated, although present demands have been reduced to 312 second feet, about 30 per cent of capacity. Water will be available in all laterals except where construction work is being done. Mr. Crawford stated, adding that demand has been lowered somewhat because many farmers have reached their three acre foot limit and must pay 30 cents per acre foot for excess water used above that figure. A 100 inch stream costs about \$1.20 a day, he stated, at the extra water rate.

Missada project demands are being supplied by normal water flow and 240 second feet of storage out of 1000 second feet now in excess on both sides of the river.
