

This is the first big test of the League Nations. If it survives the present crisis with increased prestige, its permanence may be

The League so far has been mostly an international debating society and a collector and distributor of statistics. Its severest critics will admit that along these lines it has done much useful work. It has also made some-notable contributions to world peace by restraining disturbances among small oy restraining sturroances among small powers that might have spread. But so far it has been impotent to make big powers observe the new international morality that the world hoped would prevail after the last war. Japan, "coidemined" for "unlawful and immoral aggression, went right ahead. So did Italy.






