

### SPEEDIER PROGRESS

There are going to be more changes in automobiles in the next five years than there have been in the past ten, according to Wil-liam B. Stout, president of the Society of Automotive Engineers and of the Stout Engineering Laboratories They will include de-velopments in temperature control, in the removal of excess weight, in elimination of noise and in the position of the motor. Automotive engineers now have four times as much information to work with, which is one reason why they continue improving on

the work of predecessors.

There will be just as striking changes in other lines of activity, because the automobile, which has already "remade the world," will still further influence our thought and actions. The automobile, for example, has come so quiet in operation that it has made the public sound conscious and is thus furthering the insulation of homes against outside

sounds. Other examples might be cited.

Some people may question whether the automobile is really the chief cause of such changes, but none will question that hous-ing and recreation and transportation and many other things have changed greatly since the first automobile was driven. n't matter much whether the automobile is the basic cause or merely another mani-festation of the trend. 
