



SAVAGE SLAUGHTER

The Abyssinians obviously made no resist Ance in the first stage of the Italian invasion, except light skirmishing. Villages and towns, including Aduws, were undefended in the strict military sense. Italy will doubtless pay for this in Ethiopia, through fire retailation by native troops. She is already paying for it elsewing the disapproval of nearly all the world.

Two kinds of help

As the national government pulls out of rect relief, the job should be taken over direct relief, the job should be taken over by state and local governments, not thrown on the backs of private welfare agencies, This is the epinion of Edward D. Lynde, for-merly administrator of the Family Welfare Association of America, and now executive secretary of the Cleveland Welfare Agency

There is a difference between the proper functions of public and private welfare agencies, he says. Both are needed. It is the task of private agencies to prevent "the evil results of poor social conditions." The public agencies must aid directly the victims of such conditions.

The government, for example, must take The government, for example, must take charge of criminals and offenders against society. The private agency tries to prevent a boy or girl from becoming a criminal. The public, through its established welfare de-partments, must be responsible for the phys--partinents, must be responsible for the physi-ical needs of the person ulterly without re-sources. The private agency seeks to get him back on a basis of self-support through voca-tional guidance, advice, social adjustment, and so on. It also provides constructive occu-pation for leisure time which otherwise might be put to anti-social uses.

It is possible that public and private welfare work would be divided along different lines in different communities. Although the public supports both, through taxes and through private contributions, they function more effectively as separate but co-operating groups.

FAIRS

Evidently life in this country is going to be just one fair after another. Continuity is sustained for the present by San Diego fol-lowing Chicago's two-year show. Next year comes Dallas, to be accompanied or followed by Los Angeles and Portland, In 1939 Nev York is expecting to complete this series with the biggest exposition in history.

And that may not end the thing. If all or most of these enterprises pay for themselves, or are judged successful in publicity value and general business returns, it will probably keep right on. There are plenty of cities eager to show the world what they've got. We might get into state fair competition, too, and of that there would be no end. By that time we would be well launched in the busi-ness of continuous fairs with permanent buildings for the purpose in enterprising communities.

It would probably be a good thing, too. The more people go into such activities, the more they become interested in their own

achievements and opportunities and the less they get into foreign troubles.

TO MAKE HOMES SAFE

The American Red Cross has recently add ed to its list of public services a campaign of education to prevent home accidents. Announcing the plan, Chairman Grayson re-peated the startling figure of thirty-four thousand lives lost in nineteen thirty-four in eccidents in private homes and on farms.

In its fight against this needless loss of life, the Red Cross asks residents and properly-owners to fill out forms showing potential hazards in their dwellings—loose esteps, leaky stove pipes, poorly lighted stairways, shelves too high to reach without climbing, and completes others. Thou It argas nepolic to make the indicated repairs and improvements to end these hazards.


