#### SAFETY WITH FIREARMS

As long as firearms shall remain in use accidents are bound to occur but it does seem wither ridiculous that so large a percentage of our population who use guns are unwilling to observe the few simple rules which spell the difference between safety and the constant likelihood of accident.

No man should take a loaded gun into an automobile. He may do so a hundred times without accident but always the occasion will arise when the gun will be discharged. Sometimes the careless one alone suffers, at other times a friend pays the penalty. Safety eatenes on guns are never one hundred per cent safe and should never be depended upon.

Those who attempt to climb a fence with a loaded gun in hand are foolish. The man who handles a gun in a manner rendering pos-sible an accident to life or limb in the event of accidental discharge at any time has no

business to carry a gun at all.

There is nothing new in all this. The man who likes guns and enjoys using them needs no particular lessons in their handling short of those he probably learned as a youngster-playing about with an air gun. But there is a definte percentage of persons who hunt who are a constant menace to themselves who are a constant menace to rammerives and everybody within gus shot and it is probably a waste of time to try to change this. This class of gun onthusiant cannot be protected against himself, but it is unfor-tunate that some way cannot be found to protect his victims.

Hunting is a great sport but the pleasure and satisfaction it offers is marred by the constant apprehension of accident. The most carred of hunters is in just as much danger as the novice, not because of any lack of caution on his own part but because of the constant risk attaching to-any, association, whatever with a fool with a gun in his hands.

One sympathisizes with an accident victim whether the fault be his or not but what arity it is that so many men seem to bid a pity it is that so many men seem to bid goodbye to common sense when it comes to

#### SMALL NATIONS GANG UP

Great Britain seems to be running the ahow, as regards the outlawing and punishment of Italy for aggressive war, but it is really the little nations that are in the sad-dle at Geneva. They are afraid to let linly get away with it because they see in such

a precedent peril to their own independence.
This at least must be said for the League.
For the first time in history it has provided
the machinery whereby small nations may conceivably protect themselves by ganging up against more powerful nations that they could not deal with alone or by two and threes.

threes, the big powers, notably Britain and trance, are obviously pulling some of their war chestants out of the five. Yet they are also acting as agents of the small powers and derive from the latter-most of their legal and moral authority.

legal and moral authority.

If this bold effort to curb an aggressor succeeds, therefore, it will be a triumph for the small nations—for Switzerland and Greece and Lithuania and Denmark and Peru and the rest of them.

The anonymous writer and critic known as "Unofficial Observer" makes quite a stir with his list of 25 men who "rule the world." Casual readers will notice that three of the list are Americans—President Roosevelt,

J. P. Morgan and John D. Rockefeller Jr.— and half a dozen are English, with King

and half a dozen are English, with King George rules, according to this analysis, along with Pope Plus, Leon Troisity, the Japanese emperor and Maintan Gandhi, in the "sphere of social behavior", by "mastering the conscience of humanity." This is a vague sphere of government, but very powerful. More striking than the remarkable list of

More striking than the remarkable list of world leaders is the author's prophecy of threatened doom. The world, he\_says, is "rushing headlong to the brink of catas-trophe; and from now until 1560 it will nip-and-tick whether civilization can be preserved at all, let alone the present state of affairs."

He may exaggerate. Yet the persistence He may exaggerate. Let use persistence of such yaranings from skilled observers in many countries tends to make any intelligent citizen thoughtful.

No wonder Americans are more interested in foreign affairs today than ever before, and see more clearly how the fate of nations is interwaven.


