DICTATORSHIP?

A fundamental change in the duties of ... A fundamental change in the duties of Congress has undoubtedly been brought about as a-result of the Rosevelt-policy of demanding the enactment of laws prepared under his own direction, without material mendment and for the most part without too much in the way of debate. Perhaps this is the way to do le but the practice has re-sulted in a breaking down of the constitution-al barriers as between the executive and legislative branches of government and the fact has been eagerly seized upon by critics of the administration.

Thus at Salt Lake City Senator Carey of Wyoming declares that Congress has been deprived of its Constitutional privilege of making laws and instead has become a mere rubber stamp for the administration. The result, he claims, has been the erection of a monumental bureaucracy subject only to Presidential dictatorable and which may, unless curbed, control the lives and fortunes of every American citizen.

Whether we like it or not the point re-ferred to must continue to grow in impor-ance and the day will probably come when the people of the United States will have to stand up and be counted on this question of adherence or non-adherence to the Constituof the United States.

It may be that the Constitution is out-moded and should be sitered to meet chang-ing conditions. If this is the case only the people have a right to order such a change.

If we are to have a new scheme of government, and we seem to be getting it, it should not be put over at the hands of any one man be that man President of the United States or anybody else.

As to bureaucracy, the Constitution provides no place for it. It has proved a men-age to free government and personal liberty in every country where it has gained a foot-

The State Liquor Commission has an at torney who is paid a salary of two hundred fifty dollars a month. 




