

The only way it might be accomplished would be through overwhelming defeat of the Eththrough overweining detect of the Edi-iopian forces in big battles, destroying the na-tive armies and discouraging the government and people. If Emperor Haile Sclassic can retain control of his chiefs, continue the

The danger seems to lie in his weak au-thority and the willfulness of his commanders in the field, all feudal nobles who hold the immediate loyalty of their troops. They might get themselves destroyed by rashness and lack of teamwork, or might forsake the Em-peror and make peace terms with the Italians. Delay and petty obstruction of the Italian advance are their best weapons.
