His newspapers alone are worth millions, added to which he is the owner of real property in California and elsewhere worth further millions. His great ranch home, set in the center of a tract of several thousand acres, is in itself worth a

Mr. Hearst is undoubtedly well able to pay his taxes, in California as elsewhere, but Mr. Hearst expects to establish permanent residence in some other State as a means of protesting against increasing taxes. The public not apt to worry much over the case of Mr. Hearst but the fact remains, unduly high taxes all too often drive capital into hiding. California has added a good deal to the cost of living through the imposition of new taxes

it is a question if Mr. Hearst will improve his position very much by moving into some other State. He might gain a measure of temporary relief because not all States have as high a tax rate as has California. But the relief will be only temporary. High taxes.
State and Federal, must continue and increase as long as the theory that excessive public spending is the way to prosperity re-mains the dominant note in government.
