STATE RANKS LOW
AID TO SCHOOLS

Condle Sees Much to Be Done to Lift Equalization Program

BOISE, Oct. 26 (AP)—Idaho ranked 36th among the states of the union in per cent of state support for elementary and secondary public schools at the beginning of 1935.

John D. Condle, state superintendent of public instruction, wrote in pamphlets mailed out for the assistance of educators in arranging programs for Idaho Education week, November 11 to 17.

The state contributed 92 per cent of the cost of operating the grade and high schools, and the rest of the necessary funds came from local taxing sources.

He referred to the sales tax, the beer tax, motor vehicle license as types of legislation which will contribute to the cause of equalization throughout the state.

As an example of poor equalization of the cost of education, he recalled the case of Carbon county for 1933-1934 school year.

He observed that Idaho's cost of education as based on average per capita income, is considerably below the average for the nation.

He estimated that approximately 120,000 grade and high school children are enrolled and that about 10,000 others are in universities and other schools in this state.

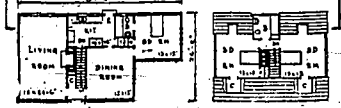
