Up to within a year or two the United States had always been a country which fed itself. Today a large part of the food supplies of the nation are actually imported from foreign countries. For years there were heavy exports of surplus corn, rye, lard and pork and a substantial world market for it all. Contrast this with the fact that so far this year we have imported twenty-eight million bushels of wheat, thirty-four million bushels of corn, eleven million bushels of rye. twelve million pounds of lard and six mil-

lion pounds of pork.

In other words, under the present policy of the Department of Agriculture with its killing off of hogs and its curtailment of crops we no langer grow enough foodstuffs to feed ourselves but are compelled instead to draw

upon foreign countries for a very considerable part of our food necessities.

In the matter of agricultural products the fact of the matter is that this country has lost its foreign markets and because we are compelled to buy instead of sell the entire world market structure is adversely affected

compelled to buy instead of sell the entire world market structure is adversely affected in-respect-of-the-United-States.

In-this-connection here are the views of Representative Christianson of Minnesota. He is quoted in a recent speech:

"The future of agriculture calls for-increased, not reduced, production; for the development of markets, not restriction of-output-They condemn the administration for permitting the country to be flooded with cheap-foodstuffs from abroad and, for failing to take even a single step intelligently directed toward the opening-of-oxport channels.

"Without a large export market, it would not have been possible for 30 million people to engage in farming in the United States; and without the restoration of such a market it is not, probable that 30 million people ever will again be profitably employed in agriculture in this country."
