



THE TIDE TURNS

By no stretch of the imagination can the results of the balloting in Tuesday's elections be twisted into an endorsement of the New Deal. In the State of New York an erstwhile Democratic lower house goes over into the Republican column. In Philadelphia, in a bitter partisan struggle, a Republican Mayor wins over his Democratic opponent. Both Cleveland and Columbus elected Republican candidates for the Mayorship as did at least half of all Ohio cities where City election were fought out on a political basis. In Nev Jersey Republicans lead in a majority of all can majorities in both State senate and lower house have apparently been attained.

It is too early yet to reach a definite con-lusion as to the full significance of the results. Up to an early hour yesterday morning returns were not complete in many cases and it may be some days before the final figures are tabulated but upon the basis of even the incomplete returns it is apparent that some thing happened which could not have hap-pened eighteen months ago or even a year

Democratic Chairman Farley has said right along that the New York elections cons-tituted the test of the President's popularity He would have done better had he said a test of the New Deal and the administration policies as a whole. There is no discounting the personal popularity of the President but there is no getting away from the fact that confidence in the outcome of the National recovery program as set up by the "Brain is less robust than it was just a few short months ago.

GERMAN BOOK CRISIS

The entire publishing and printing business of Germany is reported to be in a critical state, brought about by the decline of ical state, brough about by the decinio of German literary production. In an effort to start a Nazi literary renaissance a national-"week of the German book" was held recent-ly, beginning with the placing of wreaths on the graves of Goethe and Schiller.

Dr. Goebbels, Minister of Propaganda, made a public address in which he said that his government had done everything it could to promote the book trade and particularly to help "hitherto unknown authors" of the Nazi movement.

Nothing seems to have been said directly about the burning of banned books in 1933. Since that date there has been a sharp decline in publications of all sorts, especially of books and music. To revive the shrinking-foreign market the export price on all German books has been cut one-fourth.


