### EDUCATION FIGURES IN RELIEF PROGRAM

#### Hopkins Considers Revival of Federal Aid for Students

WASHINGTON, Nov. 7 (AP)—Henry W. Hopkins was reported today to be considering a plan to revive an education program which provided instruction for 2,000,000 persons last year.

The program last year was carried on by the Federal Emergency Relief Administration, which is to be liquidated. Under the new plan \$11,000,000 would be allotted from the Progress Administration funds to pay the salaries of 40,000 needy teachers.

Children between the ages of 2 to 4 would be cared for in nursery schools, and there would be classes in adult education, vocational training, workers' education, and in teaching grown-ups to read and write.

So far, the government has expended, or allotted, about \$500,000,000 of relief funds in connection with educational projects.

#### School Construction Lags

To date, the FEERA has spent about \$20,000,000 on its own education program and approximately the same amount in aid of rural schools. The largest item in the half billion program, however, is \$338,222,614 allotted by the Public Works Administration for school construction.

"The better administration of college students aid program cost \$14,000,769 in two years before it was merged in the National Youth Administration," the new agency "expects to spend \$50,000,000 in providing part-time jobs for college and high school students, and in aiding vocational training for youths who have left school."

Classes for Civilian Conservation Corps members have cost about \$6,000,000, and another \$8,000,000 has been authorized for instruction of the \$80,000 who are now enrolled. In addition, the Civil Works Administration, the old relief administration job program, and the WPA are accounting for an estimated \$20,000,000 in school repairs and new construction.

Van Loan spent two weeks in jail last year on a non-support charge preferred by Mrs. Gertrude Van Loan, who divorced him nearly four years ago. For many years before that, she filed various proceedings against him. They were married in New York in 1915.

Miss Brydolon was divorced three years ago from W. C. Rubin, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, criminal lawyer.

# POPE DUBIOUS OF STRICT NEUTRALITY

## Idahoan Says American Security Depends Upon World Stability

TACOMA, Wash., Nov. 7 (AP)—The security of the United States from embroilment in armed conflicts "depends upon the security of the world and the best way in which we can protect ourselves is to endeavor to prevent wars from starting," United States Senator J. P. Pope (D-Idaho) told a meeting of the World Affairs Council here tonight.

"Neutrality, like Utopia, is an ideal state of affairs, and strict, unyielding neutrality would, beyond any question, keep the United States out of war," Mr. Pope declared, but he expressed doubt "if that would be done."

**Quest of Profit**

"In every spot of the earth's surface where profits might be found, American citizens are busily engaged," he said.

"If we are going to be strictly neutral, we must stop all that. We must bring our citizens home and keep them here."

"Many times I have been asked the question: 'Can America be neutral?' The best answer I believe, 'America can be neutral, but won't.' We must consider the matter diplomatically and diplomatically as it actually exists. We have only two alternatives. We must either be completely and unequally isolated and give up all the trade and financial contacts with foreign nations engaged in war, or we may continue to trade as usual. If we continue to trade as usual and foreign neutrality, we are likely to become involved in the next major war."

**Referring to the present Italo-Ethiopian war, Senator Pope recalled the passage of the "neutrality act" by the last congress. As a result of it, Americans cannot travel on Italian or Ethiopian ships, except at their own risk, and we cannot ship implements of war to either, he explained.**

"We can, however, ship cotton to Italy from which Italy can manufacture all the gun powder she ever uses. We can ship wheat without which the army can make no progress. We can ship steel which can quickly be converted into projectiles."

"Now assume that the League of Nations undertakes an embargo on such commodities to Italy to stop the war. An American ship loaded with cotton consigned to Italy enters the Mediterranean. Regardless of what cotton growers or congressmen may think, that cotton is in international-law contraband, subject to confiscation."

"But let Great Britain try to stop our ship and undertake to seize the cotton, and our government may be called on to protest. Our ship might be sunk and American newspapers would be clamoring from coast to coast that American property had been destroyed and American citizens killed by a nation, unjust act of the British navy."

**World War Efforts**

Senator Pope said the United States became involved in serious diplomatic controversies with Great Britain and Germany prior to its entrance into the World War, and "went to war to protect our trade on the high seas."

"But we do not want to go to war," he continued. "Most of us are convinced that trading with belligerents will bring on war."

"The greatest difficulty about the problem of neutrality is that you can't have your cake and eat it too. Foreign trade by which we dispose of exportable surplus of commodities produced in America, is essential to any degree of prosperity. As soon as that trade is destroyed, surplus will pile up in our warehouses, prices will decline and we will find ourselves in the throes of a depression."

"The neutrality legislation so far enacted is helpful, in that it has helped to reduce friction. I favor such legislation—but it does not go to the heart of the problem."

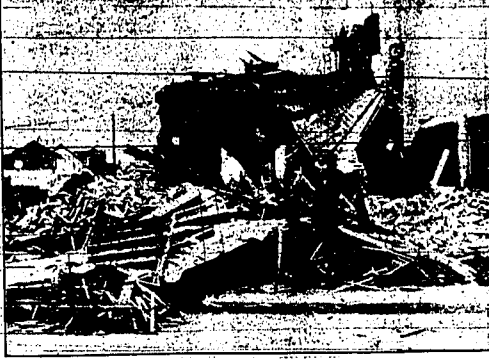

The ceremonies were held in the grand lodge room at Masonic temple and 1,500 members of the craft were in attendance, all the time.

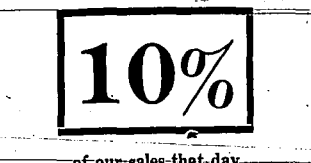
