In addition to his daughters and sons he is survived by 14 grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.

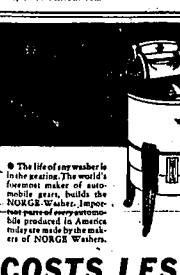

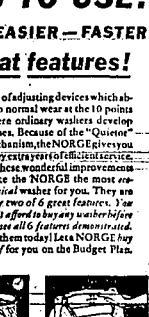
