



ONLY A TRUCE?.

Another Armistice Day. The world again vering on the brink of another war, and thought to be estating only for lack of immediate 'strength—financial and physical. Many men and women hoped, on the first Armistice Day, that the end of that particular war was the end also of all wars between the peoples of civilized countries.

Why is it that saventeen reary of the

Why is it that seventeen years after the original Armistice Day the nations still talk and think war, prepare for war and, in some places, wage war?

- Chiefly, perhaps, because people refuse to see or to surrender some of the attitudes and practices which cause wars. Most countries, most people in every country, foar and hate war and long for peace, but not quite enough-to make them give up their intense nationalism, their trade rivalries, their greed for land and power, their belief that old wrongs can be righted by new wars. -

Americans observe this anniversary as usual, with flying flags, with speeches and parades, tributes to World War dead and other appropriate ceremonies in schools, churches, and elsewhere. We should do more, giving serious study to the causes of war. November eleventh is a fresh reminder of

the ghastly days when civilized nations fought among themselves almost to the point of exhaustion and financial ruin. It is not unpatriotic to seek what may be done to pre-vent another such world-wide catastrophe.

STATE UNION AGAINST CRIME

It was natural enough that the success of Department of Justice men in rounding up kidnappers should lead people to arge the federal government to tackle the whole crime problem of the country. Most people believe, however, that it would be better for the states to strengthen their own anti-crime agencies and co-operate with each other in this work. The first Interstate Crime Commission,

created at the recent crime conference in New Jersey, is expected to prepare the way for effective co-operation: -It-will study conditions throughout the country and draft uni-form crime legislation to be submitted to state legislatures. Such taws will facilitate

state legislatures. Such laws will facilitate pursuit of thugs across state borders and the return of key wilnesses who have fled across state lines. Speaking of the plan at a public dinner, Governor Lehman of New York said:

"I-realize the difficulties of the compact process, its complexities, its comparative slowness. These, however, are not insurmountable obstacles. If the public officials of our different states are multivated by a sincere desire, much can be accomplished, and accomplished quickly."

STARS OUT OF PLACE

The Big Dipper, otherwise known as Ursa Major (Great Bear) and Charles's Wain (Charlemagne's Wagon), is slowly getting bent out of shape. In 50,000 years, says Sidney W. McCluskey of the Harvard Observatory, it will be unrecognizable.

We can stand it. But the fact is interesting, because the Dipper is merely doing what nearly all the other constellations are doing. The "fixed stars" are all moving, just like our own parent star the Sun. They move in various directions, astronomers say, and besides, the whole galaxy that we call the Milky Way, of which we are a part, is whirling like a pinwheel, so that relative positions, are continually changing. Even the North Star itself-shifts. In a few hundred or thousand years the changes become obvious.

This fact, only proved in the last half-century may account for the descriptive names of many constellations, especially signs of the zodiac, which seem to have no connection with their appearance. At the time the names were applied by Arabian or Chaldcan astronomers thousands of years ago, the present formless star groups prob-nbly suggested the names given them, as def-initely as the seven bright stars of Ursa Major suggest Big Dipper to us now.
