ANNOYING LABELS

New Yorkers are glad to be so far away from "California earthquakes" and Californians rejoice that their traffic is never up by "New York blizzards." When a Tropical blow cuts loose around the southeastern part of our map other parts of the country make a big fuss about "Florida hurricanes," the Florida editor who recently headlined a "Yankee storm" was only getting even.

People living along the Great Lakes are familiar with a tiny, harmless winged creature which emerges from the water once in its life cycle and is blown around a few hours. In the United States this ephemeral is called a "Canadian soldier," but on the northern shores it is a "Yankee soldier."

So long as it's all in good fun, it's probably all right. But in these days of strain and nervous tension it is just as well to do as little name-calling as possible. Hurricanes and earthquakes and dust storms and floods repeat more often in some regions than others, but over a long period of time they are found to be rather impartial in their visitations. Why give them sectional labels?

INTERNATIONAL INSULTS

In a recent decree the French government made it an offense to proffer insults "to the head of a foreign government or to the Minister of Foreign Affairs of a foreign state." The offense is punishable by three months' to one year's imprisonment and a fine of one hundred to three thousand francs.

The decree protects, among other possible targets of the French press, Hitler, Mussolini and Sir Samuel Hoare, all of whom are much in the news these days. It is aimed to stop the violent personal attacks in which the French press often indulges in the absence of libel restrictions.

TECHNOCRATIC DATING

He declares himself unalterably opposed to instruction that aims at indoctrination of pupils in favor of Communism. He believes that teaching Communism is bad and what it has done—just as the facts about monarchism, Fascism and other forms of government are presented in textbooks, in the classroom and in the classroom.

In this he and the many other like-minded Americans educators are exactly right. It is not the business of the schools to teach any doctrine, "tam" or set of opinions which "Communist, capitalist, socialist, mechanic, professional, intellectual, Republican, Methodist, atheist, individualist or socialist" is to be the business of the school to equip youth with the facts about whatever ideologies he is likely to encounter and encourage him to practice—weighing the evidence and drawing accurate conclusions.





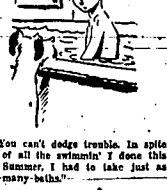

## CORN DOG RECEIPTS LEAD IDAHO'S LIST

**Sugar Beet Payments Top Federal AAA Program in Utah**

WASHINGTON, Nov. 13 (AP)—Sugar beet growers in Utah received \$82,147.11 from the agricultural administration during July and August this year for AAA benefit and "retail" payments of \$387,180.72.

In Utah the sugar payments of \$302,921 made up the biggest item, benefits paid in the corn-dog reduction program amounting to \$230,992 and wheat reduction benefits only \$24,018.69. On the basis of government aid, however, sugar beets were the minor crop in Idaho where the corn-dog program brought benefits to farmers totaling \$100,431.58 and the wheat reduction program \$67,807.64. Sugar beet payments in the state amounted to \$282,187.32.

Total benefits paid in the states were: Utah—\$51,072.46 and Idaho—\$148,156.32. Payments by counties in Idaho include:

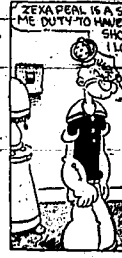

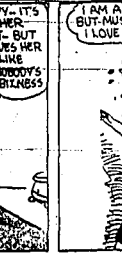

# BASEBALL WORLD MOURNS DEATH OF FRANK NAVIN

## 'Obsolete' Field Goal Stages Comeback As Effective Football Weapon

### Mickey Cochrane May Succeed To Tiger Presidency

#### Veteran Head Of Champion Detroit Club Succumbs To Heart Attack While Riding Along Bridge Path

DETROIT, Nov. 13 (AP)—The Detroit Free Press predicted tonight that Gordon S. (Mickey) Cochrane, manager of the world champion Tigers, may succeed Frank J. Navin as president of the club, or be selected to represent the owners. Navin died today, the victim of a sudden heart attack.

"Cochrane would seem to be the logical choice," the Free Press said.

DETROIT, Nov. 13 (AP)—Frank J. Navin died of a heart attack today, five weeks after his Detroit Tigers acquired the long-deferred ambition of his life by winning the world baseball championship.

He fell, unconscious, from his favorite riding horse at the Detroit riding and hunt club, and died without recovering consciousness.

Coroner Albert A. Hughes, after a postmortem examination, said death was caused by stoppage of the heart—by a blood clot in an artery.

### Famous Star Pays Tribute To Old Boss

Close associates said the 61-year-old silent man of baseball, a power for nearly three decades in the National game, has paid, almost literally, with his life for the out world championship his baseball club.

Advised to call Cobb five years ago, those friends disclosed that Cobb probably had him to must sell his baseball club and shut an excitement if his wife, and her life. Reversion of his emotions, his outstanding characteristic, had taken his toll in the end.

"He was a real credit to the game, always fair, understanding and courteous," Cobb said. "I never had dealings with a finer man. Baseball has lost one of its staunchest supporters."

Cobb was purchased from the Boston Red Sox by Navin for the sum of \$100,000, the largest sum ever paid for a player in the major leagues.

Navin's tenure was marked by the depression; he borrowed \$100,000, and bought Mickey Cochrane, a manager in the greatest gamble of his career. That was at the close of the 1923 season.

Navin died at his home today, five days ago, the inspired Tigers climaxed two successful seasons—by defeating the Chicago Cubs in the deciding game of the National League.

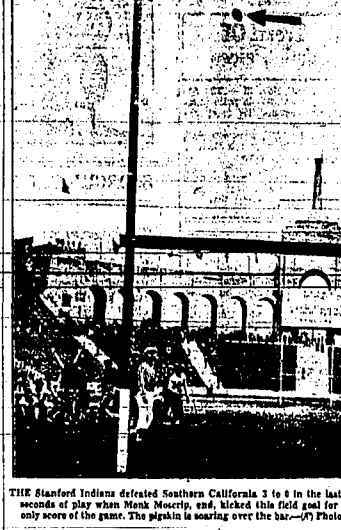

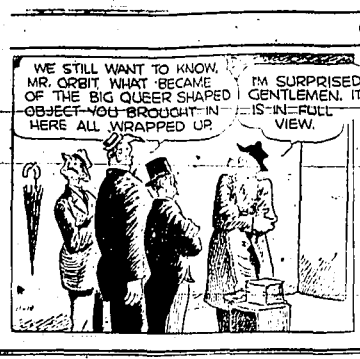

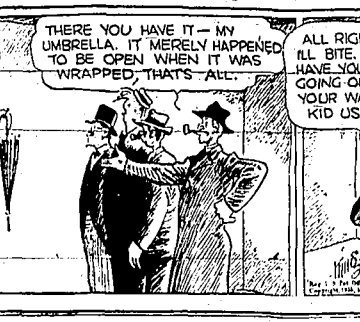
