Secretary of Commerce Roper assures American business that it need have no furth-er misgivings in the matter of government interference in business: that this phase of New Deal activity is at an end and there need be no uncertainty as to the future.

It is an important statement and one which

should be reflected at once in renewed busishould be reflected at once in renewed busi-ness activity in aimost every line. More em-ployment and increased payrolls, with in-creasing purchasing power should follow. This in turn should make for higher prices, especially for agricultural products, and a more satisfactory state of affairs in general.

This should be the effect of the statement,

receded in making the public believe that ho means what he says. There can be no ques-tion but that the element of uncertainty, uncertainty as to what the government might or might not do in the way of enacting fresh laws for the control and regulation of pri-vate business, has been one of the chief ob-stacles in the way of recovery. "Italy has not populated the colonies she has, and the world has more raw materials than it can get rid of. The real trouble is markets; and the nations of the world must get together and ellminate the lariff and money barriers to international commerce if there is to be world peace. We must afford new baying power to the one nations that 'have not,' or there will be unreasing unrest, and changer."

He may be right now, just as he probably was in the book that made him famous two decades ago-"The Great Illusion," which held that colonies are usually of little value and nations can get along better without them. The United States seems to be accenting that doctrine. But he couldn't persuade the other nations that sat at the Versailles peace table, and he can't persuade them now. Statesmens minds run in patterns that change very slowly.


