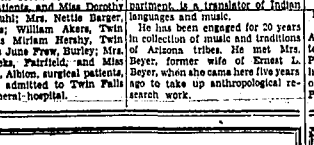

F. D. R. TO STUDY NEW DEAL BUDGET

Daily Expenditures Average \$11,226,891 More Than Federal Income

WASHINGTON, Nov. 20 (AP)—A work-streak filed with figures on the 1937 budget accompanied President Roosevelt tonight as he headed South for his annual Thanksgiving visit at Warm Springs, Georgia.

In the first 31 days of the 1936 fiscal year, his administration has averaged a daily expenditure of \$11,226,891 more than income. The president is expected to reduce the mounting debt, an increasingly prominent target for criticism by Republicans and business leaders who are among the major problems confronting the chief executive.

Before leaving the White House to board special train, Mr. Roosevelt conferred with several aides including Secretary of State Cordell Hull, Hopkins, works progress administrator Bruce B. Peckham.

They discussed the \$4,880,000,000 relief-employment campaign. While this program is scheduled to end next June, Mr. Roosevelt indicated yesterday that the federal government will not permit people to starve.

Effect recommendations for the next budget are being reviewed until the last minute to determine how best to reduce the deficit without the employment loss.

Since July 1, the government has paid out \$1,548,210,272 for what it terms general expenditures and \$1,322,071,110 assigned to recovery and relief. It has taken in \$1,297,588,208 during the budget and other work ahead of time, the president looks forward to spending many hours outdoors in the Georgia climate while continuing his observation of domestic and international affairs.

With the addition of several new canvassers in the business district yesterday, contributions to Twin Falls Community Chest rose to a total of more than \$500 last evening. The chest officials said that they believe the \$130,000 goal will be reached.

Chest officials met yesterday noon with team captains at a luncheon session and plans were outlined to bring further success of the drive.

DEFENBACH CALLS FOR PENSION PLAN

Former Official Pessimistic Over Outlook for Future

Erno Defenbach, former Idaho state treasurer and Republican candidate for governor in 1932, told an audience at the Twin Falls high school auditorium last evening that he was frankly pessimistic as to the future and declared the "forward-looking" pension plan the only economic recovery plan suggested to date that gives any promise of permanent and stable prosperity.

Speaking under the auspices of the Twin Falls Townsend club, Mr. Defenbach said: "I have an open mind. I am looking for some policy which shall spell greater economic security for the lower and middle classes of our people. At present nothing has been suggested or attempted which gives any promise of permanent and stable prosperity unless it is this Townsend economic recovery plan.



ERNO DEFENBACH, former state treasurer and auditor of Idaho history, told a public meeting under Townsend club auspices in Twin Falls last evening that "nothing has been suggested or attempted which gives any promise of permanent and stable prosperity unless it is this Townsend economic recovery plan."

"I believe that foreign trade is gone forever and that labor saving machinery and increased human efficiency have produced a permanent unemployed group of at least ten per cent of our population. In the face of all this some plan must be devised to bring about a more rapid circulation of the wealth of the country. We are not going to get a cure in 1935, only by moving them while it is starting now."

"The invitation to speak here was given me with two conditions attached; one was that I must avoid politics and the other that I was to emphasize the "economic recovery" claims of the Townsend plan rather than its humane and charitable features. It will be easy for me to comply with the first condition. I look upon this plan as a non-partisan recovery program; whatever charitable results it may bring about are secondary.

"Any economic theory must properly be based on the facts of the situation and details. The Townsend plan, or any other governmental program, if it is to be successful, must be based on the facts of the situation, not on abstract theories or other branches of government, without destroying or altering the trust. The man who favors good roads is dealing with a fundamental or basic principle; how wide the road shall be, whether it shall be paved, tiled or gravelled, these are incidental or details.

"The speaker then stated what he called the basic principle of the Townsend plan as follows:

"That the federal government of the United States shall guarantee citizens security to extend long days, by the payment of an adequate equal annuity to each citizen when he shall have reached the age of 65. The efficiency of the acceptance of this annuity shall be optional with each citizen, the only condition being that the citizen shall refrain from gainful activity and shall spend the amount of his annuity, the age at which it shall become effective, and the manner of raising the necessary revenue, are details to be determined later.
