LIBERTY LEAGUE UPHELD

There will be general interest in the vic-ory won by the American Liberty League tory won by the American Liberty League before the American Bar Association, re-garding the League's offer to defend free of charge the constitutional rights of citizens unable to employ counsel. The Association's committee on professional ethics has sanc-tioned such action, despite protests filed by many members.

-Indigent citizens throughout the country, the committee observes, are often defended without compensation. Such proffer of ser-vice, even when broadcast over the radio, "does not offend the ethics code." The issues involved "transcend the range of professional ethics." The committee welcomes the general offer of such services even if made by or-ganized groups "on the other aide" of questions in which the Liberty League is interested. "Such an eventuality is more to be desired than feared," it says.

So the Liberty League may go as far as it likes in providing lawyers for citizens who think their constitutional rights of person or property are threatened, say, by government action. And apparently any other organization may go as far as it-likes in providing free legal service for citizens who think their constitutional rights of free press, speech, assembly, habeas corpus, reasonable bail, and so on, are threatened by public authorities anywhere in the country.

There are obviously many sides to the Con-

stitution, and many kinds of rights guaranstead by it, and many interpretations of those rights. There should be a free field for law-ful presentation of all points of view.

GAS TAXES

Yes, gasoline taxes are high and consumers Yes, gasoline taxes are nign and consumers, kick about them. Levies run from two to seven cents a gallon, the former rate being exemplified in Washington, District of Co-lumbia, and the latter in Tennessee and Florida. Twenty representative states collected two hundred sixty-five million dollars last year from these taxes. Texas chipped in thirty-seven million and California thirty-

Our retail prices may run from fifteen to twenty-five cents a gallon. In Canada and Latin-America they are higher, and in most European countries gas costs at least double the American price. In Italy it has gone above a dollar a gallon. Those foreign prices are largely due to taxes higher than ours.


