STATE DEPARTMENT AGAIN OPENS FIRE UPON WAR PROFITS

U. S. Pledges to Course of Independent Neutrality; Munitions Sales to Belligerents Called Abnormal

(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, Nov. 26.—In unusually emphatic language, a state department spokesman today lashed at the making of war profits by small groups and hit at what were termed abnormal sales of war supplies to Italy and Ethiopia.

The same high official, who declined to be quoted, asserted the administration was "uncompromisingly determined to pursue a completely independent neutrality, regardless of what any other nation or group of nations may do."

This statement directed at reports that the League of Nations deputy in considering an oil and steel embargo against Italy, caused the American government to lessen its pressure against such exports to both belligerents.

Southern Idaho's greatest manhunt ended yesterday with the capture at daybreak of Douglas Van Vlack, 31, of Tacoma, and the abandonment late in the afternoon of the search here for his allegedly kidnaped former wife, Mildred Hook, 22, who wandered with Hollister during the night through the wind-swept desert about Hollister after he allegedly shot and killed Fontaine Cooper, state traffic officer, and severely wounded Henry C. Givens of Twin Falls at Bull early Monday afternoon.

Blame In Law

PROSECUTOR SUPPORTS WIFE'S SELF-DEFENSE CLAIM IN MURDER TRIAL

WALLACE, Idaho, Nov. 26 (AP)—M. M. Angel, Idaho state prosecuting attorney, took the witness stand in the murder trial today to support his wife's contention that she shot to death her husband on September 23 in self-defense.

Further testimony was also introduced by the defense to substantiate the claim that the woman was not the aggressor in the shooting and that she had been attacked by her husband.

GOVERNMENT AND UTILITIES CLASH

Refusals to Register Bring Securities Commission Showdown

WASHINGTON, Nov. 26.—Differing views between utilities and the New Deal have led to a showdown today between the Federal Securities Commission and the holding company law.

The government took its first legal step in New York City when the commission asked the Southern district court to compel the plant Electric Bond and Share company and five of its intermediate holding companies to register by December 1.

This suit was offered the utilities as a case to try the law's validity and tentatively was accepted by E. B. D.

Death Sentence Charged

In Washington, the North American company, another big holding concern, asked the District of Columbia supreme court to enjoin the commission from enforcing the act. It said the statute contained a "deadly sentence" against companies and contended it was unconstitutional.

This made four major companies in the North American, Commonwealth and Southern corporation, and United States Improvement Company of Philadelphia—that have asked injunctions against the government.

Both another step was taken by another outstanding utility concern, The Public Service corporation of New Jersey applied to the commission for exemption from operation of the holding company law. Thomas H. McCarter, president, told stockholders contained advanced the corporation's business as predominantly, if not entirely, carried on in the state of New Jersey.

The law exempts companies predominantly intrastate.

"Although it grieves me to have to say so, I simply do not believe that the German people with respect to Jewish athletes and other so-called non-Aryan athletes, have been kept."

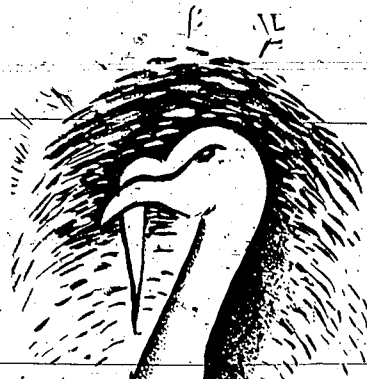

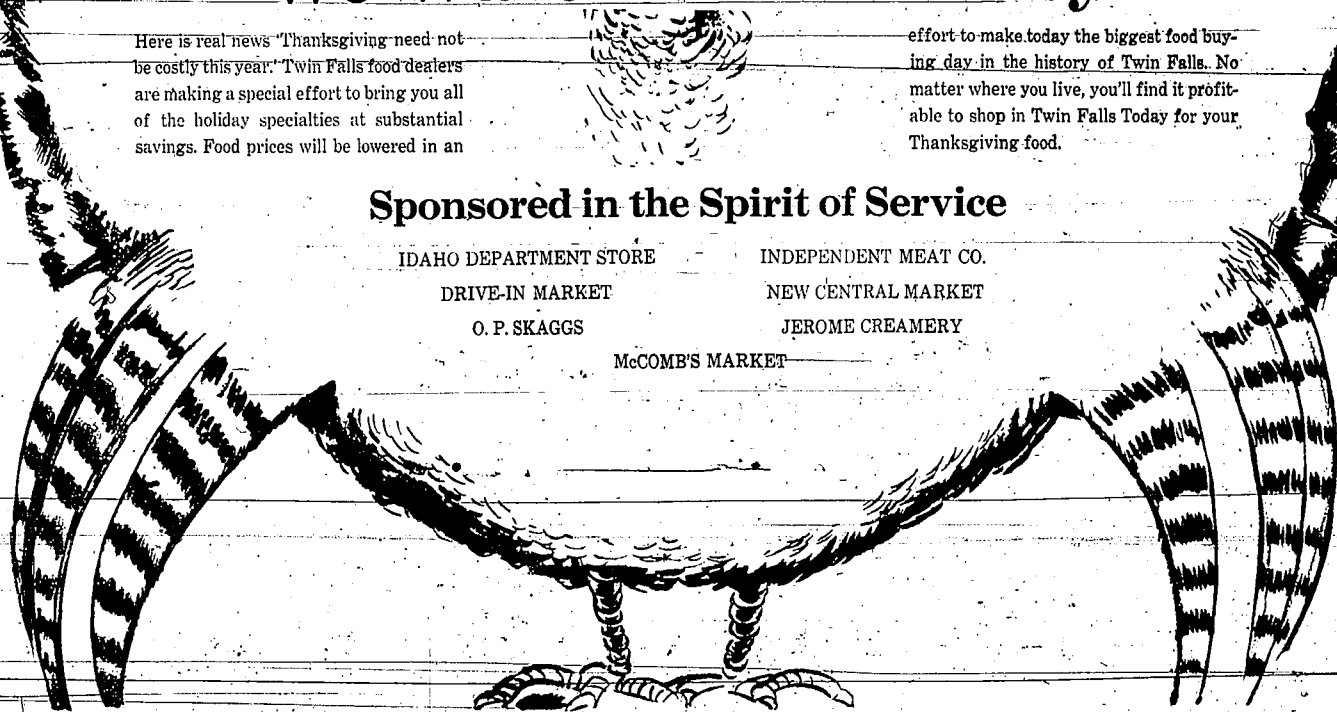

Clever Cooks Plan Ahead For Thanksgiving Feasts

Everyone enjoys Thanksgiving day—the anticipation of a grand dinner—and the satisfying reprieve, the "I ate too much but it was worth it" feeling that comes afterward. Everyone that is, but the cook. Unless she happens to be a homemaker who plans ahead.

Salads That Go Well With Festive Fowls

Certain salads seem to have a special affinity for the food combinations usually decided upon for Thanksgiving day. They give point and contrast to the richness of turkey, goose or chicken. Sometimes a fruit salad is chosen, again a plain vegetable.

Medium-Sized Salad
1 small cooked cup cooked cauliflower
1 cup carrots
1 cup green pepper
Separate cauliflower into small pieces. Marinate each vegetable separately in French dressing. Arrange vegetables on plate, leaving leaves in separate rows and sprinkle with chopped green pepper. Serve with French dressing.

Pineapple Salad

Make a rather hot lemon jelly. When the jelly is cool but not set, partly fill small molds. Set into the molds a pimento cup filled with chopped celery mixed with a little mayonnaise. Cover with jelly and conceal. Serve in little lettuce cups with mayonnaise.

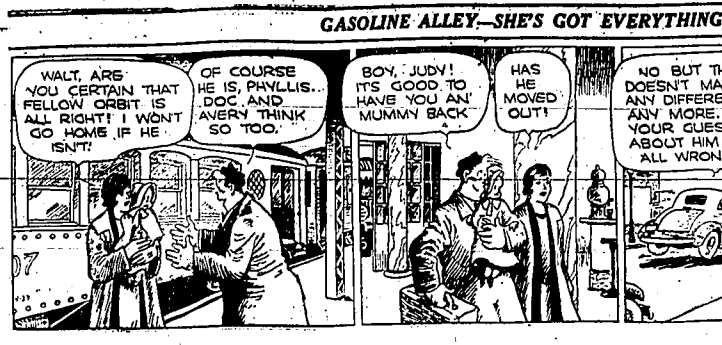
