

THANKSGIVING

Thanksgiving Day, with its varying emo tions and warm appeal is just as much a factor in our present day life as it was in the days when the Pilgrim Fathers gathered the festive board to offer up their humble thanks for the blessings of another year of individual and community good.

In a sense it may be argued that the prob-lems which confronted the first settlers were more aggravated than those with which the present generation has to deal.
