Georgia-Governor-Lite-Accusations Against New Deal

ATLANTA, Nov. 28 (AP)—Governor Talmadge yesterday challenged President Roosevelt to defend the A. A. A., the Bankhead act, lack of denominational churches at Norris, Tennessee, and the relief payroll of Rexford Tugwell.

The Georgia governor, critic of the administration's policies in an article appearing in the current issue of his paper "The Statesman," asked the president to answer three "accusations" when he speaks in Atlanta Friday.

President to Broadcast
Mr. Roosevelt is to be honored at a "homecoming" celebration here the day after Thanksgiving. Those in charge of the event expect 100,000 persons to hear the president's address, scheduled between 1:30 and 2 p. m. central standard time.

Talmadge made his article available to the press about the time he received a communication from Warm Springs, where Mr. Roosevelt is spending the holidays, in reply to his welcome to the president.

The letter said:
"Thank you for your note. I am glad to be back in Georgia and I am looking forward, always, to a very fruitful and pleasant visit."

The governor's letter brief-welcomed the president's election as the secretary Carlton Mobley, who served Georgia in congress for a short time a few years ago; Marvin McIntire, head of the secretarial staff at Warm Springs, received Mobley's note.

Liste Accusations
Talmadge listed his "accusations" in his paper as follows:

1. That the Tennessee valley authority has copied communism by refusing to permit denominational churches to be built at Norris, Tennessee.
2. That Assistant Secretary of Agriculture Tugwell has a staff of 12,000 men drawing \$1,750,000 monthly to create 5,012 relief jobs paying \$100.00 per month.
3. That the A. A. A. and the Bankhead act are unconstitutional and unfair to the farmers of the nation.

The president will be here in Atlanta on Friday, November 29 to speak, the article read. "I wish that he would answer the above accusations."
"I also wish that he could see the mail that I receive every day and give an answer to the thousands of men, women and children not only in Georgia but throughout this country, who are being treated all day long in a most deplorable manner by the administration he has forced on our country."

Brookhart's Attack On Landon Rebuked

OKLAHOMA CITY, Nov. 28 (AP)—Attacking a statement of former Senator Smith W. Brookhart of 1928 that Governor Alvin K. Landon of Kansas was the "Standard Oil" candidate for president, Wirt Franklin, leading Oklahoma independent oil producer, declared last night Brookhart's words were "erroneous" and "absurd."
"Anyone who knows the private and business life of Governor Landon as I do, knows the absurdity of his statement. Landon has in any way controlled or influenced by the Standard Oil or other interests," the oil man said. Franklin is organizer of the former president of the Independent Petroleum Association of America.

FAIRLEY'S FIGURES ON SAVINGS CHALLENGED

WASHINGTON, Nov. 28 (AP)—Representative Bolton (R-Ohio) asserted last night that "Jugler Jim Fairley" is "throwing figures around with the same abandon that the late deal squandered the taxpayers' money."

The chairman of the Republican committee challenged Fairley's "amazing revelation" at Denver, November 25, that "regular activities of the various departments of the government have been diminished by something approaching a billion dollars a year."
"One only has to take the new deal's own treasury daily statement to disprove Mr. Fairley's utterly absurd contention," Bolton said. "By routine costs of government, it must be presumed that Mr. Fairley means ordinary costs an differentiation of emergency costs."

"Even with the two sets of bookkeeping which new deal's report is, a glance in new deal's fiscal affairs discloses that the routine costs of government on November 23 this year, were nearly \$33,000,000 more than for the corresponding figure of last year and, there are only eight months of the current fiscal year to go."
