### MATCH AND POWDER KEG

Possibility of war in Europe is perhaps greater today, than at any time since the greater today than at any time saine the Italian invasion of Ethiopia, and there have been times during the past few months when actual hostilities seemed unavoidable.

It is apparent that England and France will act as a unit in the event of Italian at-tack upon British Mediterranean forces and unless Mussolini recedes from the position he has taken on the right of sanctions, an Italian military demonstration of some sort eems to be a foregone conclusion.

Thus again the stage is set for the opening of another European war. Should it come it is too much to expect that the fighting will be confined to the three countries now chiefly-concerned or that any sort of settlement will be possible without extended fighting. The United States with all her vaunted dethe billed states with an her variety in the matter of geographical location, is in no different position to those other nations which

have agreed to sanctions.

The old story of the match and the powder keg is being reenacted in the Mediterranean. Relations are not only strained but feeling grows more acute with every passing hour. Will Italy back down from the position she

has taken in the matter of sanctions? Upon the answer the question of a general Euro-pean war probably depends. England and France are not apt to alter their views and the French ultimatum is capable of no two constructions

This seems to be the gist of an opinion handed down in Federal Court at Boise in the matter of the suit brought to enjoin the collection of further tolls by the operating

It would be a very good thing for all Southern Idaho if the matter of the tolls were eliminated, that is to say if the bridge were state owned or county owned instead of pri-vately owned but the decision makes it per-fectly plain that there is more than one way in which this may be done but that the meth attempted in this particular suit is not

one of them-"Unless" declares the decision and the words "and until" should have followed but didn't, "the communistic theory of exappropriation of private property has been firmly founded in our jurisprudence, equity cannot look with favor upon this attempt to destroy the fruits of private initiative exerclsed with the encouragement of the officials of the State and the communities involved, by outright confiscation without compensation \* \* \*"

These are strong words but they go straight to the traditional principle that no one ghall be deprived of property without due process of law. ### UNWELCOME GOLD

Many Americans who used to consider gold an unmitigated blessing are beginning to worry about it, as foseign gold pours into the United States and is interned in the fedcome from abroad since our government de-valued gold, and we now have about half thegold in the world.

The remaining monetary gold is mostly in France and Russia, with Great Britain third. Germany, Italy, Japan and other important dermany, they, salan and the important nations have hardly enough left to talk about. Many of them have begun to wonder whether their lost gold will ever come back, and therefore whether they will ever be able to return to a gold standard.

to a gold standard.

It is evident that this over balancing rush
of gold to America is delaying indefinitely
the recestablishment of world currencies-on
a gold basis, which was looked forward to confidently, nyear ago. Financiers and states-men abroad begin to question whether it will-ever be possible for them to return to gold, and whether it would be really necessary or desirable if they could. They nearly all get along now with a "managed" currency. They might conceivably adopt some permanent nystem of atchange dispensing with gold. All this naturally leaves Uncle Sam on an

The announcement that half of the fe The announcement that half of the forestowns ceedings so far instituted by the Home Owners' L corporation represent borrowers who deliberately fused to meet loan payments when due, although susce to meet loan payments when doe, although ac-tually able to do so, comes as a sorry reflection upon the honesty and lack of appreciation of a segment of the American people. It is reassuring to note, however, that this number of deliberate defaulters is relatively amail. As the corporation has granted 95,729 hone-ricled fones in the amount of almost three billion dol-lars, the present foreclosure total of 2,963 is actually equivalent to only about one foreclosure proceeding to every 202 loans made.
