

### ANOTHER INCOME TAX

It is a good thing that the average man is not\_altogether conscious of the extent to which taxation has eaten into his income during the past few years. He remembers only occasionally that he pays a tax of six cents with every gallon of gas he buys or that every package of cigarettes costs him a minimum of six cents in tax. The income tax was not an important factor to most people even after the Federal tax was duplicated by a State lovy and both were upped sharply. The so-called invisible tax has its invisibility to recommend it anyway.

recommend it anyway.

But the sales tax strikes directly at the man least able to pay it and the new payroll tax which goes into effect January first will miss practically nobody. There are exceptions of sorts but in the main average incomes will be taxed one per cent during the year to come, two per cent in nincteen hun-dred thirty-seven and three per cent there-after. The man or woman who gets the pay cheque will pay this amount, added to which the employer will dig up a similar amount. Beginning in nineteen hundred thirty-seven this entire tax set-up will be duplicated by a similar levy in the same amount. Double taxation on profits and dividends was provided for some time ago by the Federal gov-ernment and the Idaho Legislature naturally followed suit, so that without taking the increase in rates into consideration this class of taxable property is assessed just four times as much as it was only a few short




