



Countries.

According to the National Geographic Society three countries produce about eightyone per cent of the world's supply of petroleum. These are the United States, Russia and Venezuela. Of the remaining production ngland's colonial possessions produce the bulk. All the remaining deposits in the world so far brought to light could do but little for any country unable to obtain petroleum from the four sources referred to. If these supplies were shut off completely motor transportation throughout the world would be stopped in a very short time.

The principle of the embargo or "sanc-tions" may yet constitute a weapon of great-er menace than bullets and bayonets, airplanes and tanks. No civilized country today could function long without oil and its de rivatives. Countries at war are peculiarly exposed because of the growing dependence of the war machine upon motor transport. No airplane yet invented is able to fly without gasoline.

year's achievements, tells of fluoroscopic examinations of high school pupils, establish-ment of a graduate school for training nurses in the case of tuberculosis, health camps for boys and girls and a wholesome spring clean-up. Similar work is done all over the country, much of it financed by the seal funds.






