

INTERESTING SPEECHES

There is no gainsaying the personal and political popularity of Alf M. Landon, Re-publican governor of Kansas. A reference to Landon by Senator Capper us the next President of the United States recently was greet-ed with applause which amounted to an ova-tion. Moreover, Governor Landon seems to have what it takes. His public utterances to date stamp him as an outstanding critic of the administration and he has the happy faculty of expressing himself in a manner which

Today there are three outstanding possibilities for the Republican nomination for the presidency, Senator W. E. Borah, Colonel Frank Knox and Governor Landon yet it may be that none of these will be selected as the official standard hearer. But the effect of the utterances of all three will be to crystalize public thought along political lines and to help weld into a cohesive whole that element among the voters Republicans and Democrats alike, which is unwilling longer to support the New Deal.

And there is plenty of evidence of growing distrust of many features of the Roosevelt recovery program. Recent Supreme Court decisions have not added to public confi-dence. Centralization of power in the Na-tion's capital, invasion of state's rights, an unbalanced budget and a mounting public debt cannot be dismissed lightly on the ground merely that business conditions show an improvement, notwithstanding the fact usiness conditions have improved, materially.

The coming election promises to be one of the most significant of history. Broadly speaking, to date it is a question of the Constitution and the Supreme Court on the one hand and regimentation and control of crops, livestock, labor and industry, Constitution or no Constitution, on the other

BEATING SOCIAL SECURITY

"Social security seems to contain a lot within itself to defeat itself," observes a bus-iness writer, "The race to leat it by mechanization is on in nearly every business unit in the land."

The discovery that surprised the committee most was that farmers do not want their children taught agriculture, parents in in-

It may be, says the committee report, "that people do not wish their children to engage in the same occupations as their parents, or they may feel, that formal training is not necessary.

It may be, too, that parents want their children to have a broader education than they thomselves have had. They may believe that specialization comes more easily and effectively after a sound foundation of general

education has been built.

There is a chance, too, that farmers, industrial workers and tradespeople have been dis-satisfied with the special courses which have been offered in those subjects, finding them superficial and not particularly helpful. They regard them as a waste of time that might better be devoted to improving English. mathematics and spelling, three subjects which stood at the top in preference.
