A MEMORIAL OF GOOD WORKS

In some places there has been misunder-standing of the proposed Will Rogers Me-morial Fund. Readers have written to news-paper editors asking why it should be necessary to raise money by public subscription for a monument to Rogers. Others have said they didn't think Will would have wanted an expensive monument to himself, and so on

The national committee should continue to make it quite plain, as they did in their original announcements, that the memorial will and announcements, that the memorial will be no mere mountagle of stone. It will be a trust fund or an evenwed institution or some other practical undertaking devoted to help-ing the suffering or handlacpped or needy, as Will Rogers always helped them during his lifetime. The committee stated that final decision as to the precise form of the memorial would depend upon the amount of money

It is possible that the arrangement made with one community will be extended to others. Permission has been given in a populous industrial county to use half the funds raised locally for the establishment of a per-manent camp for crippled children. The other half will go to the national memorial.

That is what has been done with the money raised by the president's birthday balls, local raised by the president's birthary batts, local communities using part of the money for local victims of infantile paralysis while the rest has gone to develop research work at Warm Springs, Georgia.

DEMOCRACY'S SAFEST VALVE

A distinguished foreign author, visiting in the United States, stopped at a hotel where labor pickets were marching up and down on the sidewalk, carrying their placards condemning the management's treatment of union labor. Said the foreigner: "I do not know who is right in this, but

it is significant that this is the only country in the world where you can see a man or a group of men thus express their thoughts. It is a fine thing!

It is a line thing.

If does not require loyalty to the union movement, or even knowledge of this particular employer-worker dispute, to enable a thoughtful American to agree with the visitor. Freedom to criticise and to express dissatisfaction with employer or government is a safety valve for democracy.




