

General Wayne was a soldier by instinct yet his name is coupled with but one outstanding achievement. By a cleverly planned and forcefully conducted attack he broke the backbone of the Indian resistance to American colonization after a series of disasterous failures at the hands of lesser leaders. The victory resulted in the signing of a treaty between the government and the Indians and lead directly to one of the biggest of all forward steps in the work of subdulps and occunving the West.

Now the city of Greenville, Ohio, where the trenty was signed, proposes to creet a memorial building with Congressional aid, in commemoration of the achievements of General Wayne. There can be no question of the value of the service rendered, in fact the exploit ranks among the important military feats of the century.

A FULL LIFE

A full and active life comes to a close with the demise of Harry T. West, long time resi-dent of the Twin Falls country and widely known as farmer and business man. Mr. West's career was an interesting one.

While interested chiefly in agriculture and horticulture he found time for a number of business ventures in other fields. At one time he engaged successfully in the fishing business off the coast of Washington, bring-ing to bear upon the undertaking a spirit of enterprise which established a new record in the business. 




