MANY KNOT BOARDS GET HIGH RATING

Complete Results of Area Competition for Boy Scouts Announced

Complete results of the Snake river area knot board contest which closed recently and featured 1413 knots on 70 boards, were announced from Scout headquarters yesterday.

Shoshone Board Best Outstanding board, according to the judges, was made by four Shoshone Scouts who made a knot on a large replica of a first class scout badge, six feet in length. This board did not compete for individual honors, but it used by the troop for instruction purposes.

Varied shapes of boards were designed. Some were made in the shape of home poles while others were squares, rectangles, diamond shaped and circular. Many others were cut to display various knots in sculpture. Troop 69 of Twin Falls had individual boards, each board representing a letter or figure in "Troop 69". Some boards were hinged to fold up, one was made from rustic wood.

One of the most unique boards was made by Lucille Wilder. It was a small cabinet with three drawers, two of the drawers having shelves with the knots tied on the shelves with numbers carved under each knot, corresponding to a key giving the names of each knot. In the third drawer were pieces of carved wood such as a jack-knife with blades that opened up, a handle with hinged stirrups, a hammer, screw driver, nails and other bits of experimental carpentry.

GROWERS URGED TO ASK CROP CONTROL

Wheat Allotment Committee Announces Extension of Deadline

The final date for receiving applications for the 1936-1937 wheat allotment contract has been extended from December 15 to December 31, Twin Falls County Wheat Allotment committee announced last evening.

The committee at the same time announced that the wheat allotment program during the past two years had brought into Twin Falls county \$44,000,000 in adjusted payments, and local expenses of the county wheat production-control association, and argued that "aside from the value of the adjusted programs to the agriculture of this county, the payments received by the wheat growers for the acreage taken out of wheat production is such a high rental per acre that any farmer who has a wheat base of any consequence can not, purely from the money standpoint, afford to stay out of the wheat program."

Under the old contract, the committee said, the average annual rental received by the grower in this county amounted to \$72.38 per acre.

The committee's statement said that some Twin Falls county farmers have an "erroneous idea that the wheat program is a government program and that the government is going to let them what to grow a public farm" in retaliation of this idea the committee asserted that "the wheat growers of the United States asked for the wheat adjustment program, have worked out the plan for its operation and have used the facilities offered by the government to carry out the program."

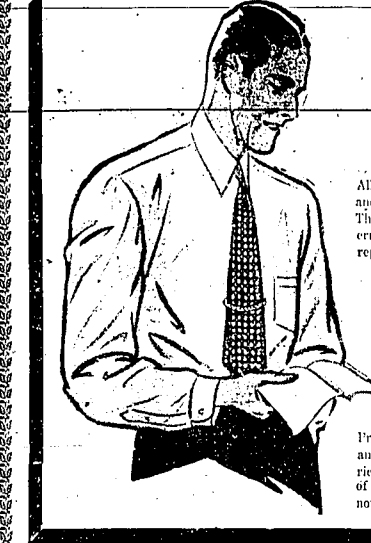

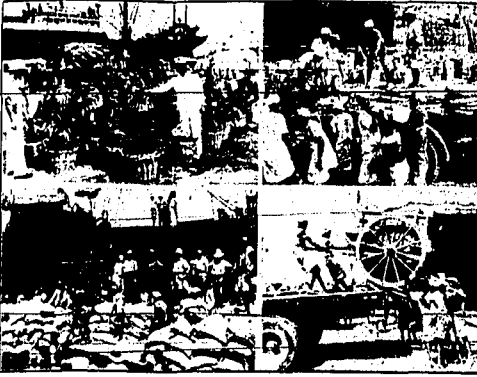

U. S. Neutrality Policy Broadened in History

WASHINGTON (AP)—The broadest neutrality policy in American history was enunciated in 1935.

Congress passed an act specifically making unlawful the export of arms, munitions or other implements of war to belligerents. The President directed to enumerate commodities whose export was prohibited, had authority to deny such supplies of oil, coal, iron and steel to belligerents in addition to guns and bullets.

War Danger Develops

The past year saw the sudden development, in 1935, of the most real danger since Versailles. It also witnessed, on the other hand, the easing of tensions that threatened as great possibilities of trouble.

Germany regained the Saar basin, and Reichsteiner Hitler's disclaimer of any territorial ambitions as far as France was concerned calmed fears of a clash on the Rhine. Poland and the Reich laid the troublesome Polish corridor question with a 10-year treaty.

Possibilities of trouble still lurk in Austria and "Mittel Europe" in the situation appear chaotic, rather than acute. Bolivia and Paraguay have relegated their sanguinary combat to the Gran Chaco in the stage of diplomatic conferences.

Peace-seeking statesmen in the early days of 1935 look with concern

at 1935's "colonial expedition," which led the League of Nations' power and brought the threat of war in the Mediterranean or Europe itself, dominated the international scene in 1935.

to the steady westward march of Japanese influence. Just as it spread across Manchuria to help pry that rich territory from China's rule, it has reached into China proper where Nanking's hold on the five Northern provinces has grown weaker.

Re-armed to the Teeth As Japanese and Russian interests near each other in outer Mongolia, new possibilities of a clash appear. But both Japan and Russia have disclaimed any desire for war.

The world is re-armed to the teeth. The naval limitation treaties of Washington and London were scrapped. Few statesmen have been willing to predict success for the new parity on the Thames.

A re-arming Germany caused war predictions in 1935, but Great Britain recognized the end of the Versailles restrictions in a bilateral naval agreement with the Reich.

# REVIEWING THE 1935 SPORTS PARADE

## 2. Little Keeps British and U.S. Golf Titles

By BOB CAYANABO

(Associated Press Staff Writer)

NEW YORK (AP)—Take a quick, kaleidoscopic view of the 1935 golf camera and your picture will have difficulty penetrating beyond the Gollath-like figure of William Lister Little.



LAWSON LITTLE

The year furnished a couple of major surprises and saw the great Glenora Colletti Vase restored to the queen's throne of American women's golf, but Little's feat of retaining the British and American amateur titles which he captured in 1934 is unparalleled in links history.

For all his title achievements the great, Job Jones, not only the best that matter can boast of four successive major amateur championships. Little established this record in the brief space of 17 months, starting in May, 1934, and winding up in September, 1935, at Cleveland.

When Little strode out in defense of the two amateur championships his chances were rated no better than those of any of his 200 odd challengers in each tournament. But with the passing of the days, Little divided and headed for the stretch drive, the king of the amon-purs retained his regal throne.

Pressed in British Finals

In both finals, at 20 holes Little was hard-pressed and like the champion he is closed out his rivals with brilliant displays. Never at any stage of his first British match against Dr. William Tweed did Little ever more than four up in abrupt contrast to the half-way lead of 12 holes he held over Jim Wallace in the 1934 win-up.

Against the Briton, who played better golf than Little in the afternoon round, the San Francisco player was down one at the 30th hole. Little, who sliced his drive sharply. The ball landed on a barren spot and was partly embedded. Tweed, who was well on his way to certain of his first British match was a difficult shot on a drive—slicing it with a hard, dead, and clean. As the thousands watched, Little executed the selling shot almost perfectly and got down in two putts for a half in Little three up.

Set Muirfield Record

In addition to those sterling performances Little gave a surprising account of himself in two important events. He finished sixth in the Bobby Jones' Masters tournament at Augusta, and tied Great Britain's Bert Oats for fourth place in the British Open. A final, three-under-par 69 gave Little a course record for the Muirfield course—and a 72-hole aggregate of 289—three strokes better than his 4 to end the match.

Walter Hagen, the 1923 intercollegiate champion, proved even harder to handle in the American final. He fitted a pair of birdies at Little on the first two holes and almost before you could say Jack Robinson the Oklahoma had "Little" three down through the fifth. Little started the winning process on the sixth—a birdie—and finally wiped out his opponent's advantage on the 13th and took lasting command on the 31st. A birdie at the 38th put

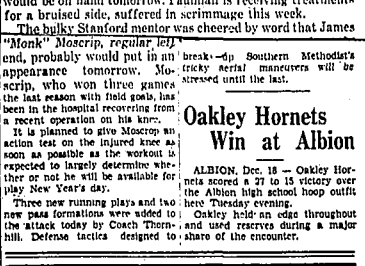

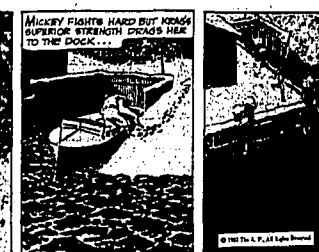

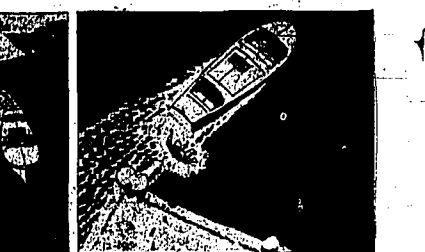
