salute, dealing with Jews, and so on, but these sufficiently reveal the perils of going in for who)sale prohibitions. When governments of dictators start telling people what hey must not do, they go to strange ex-teriors.

INSTEAD OF NAVIES

Perhaps in some future time today's squabbling about the respective sizes of the world's navies will seem unreal. If nations could learn to buy and sell real estate, as private citizens do, they would not have to go out and take it by conquest. They could then put the same vast sums of money and the same careful planning into the health and education of their citizens and the de velopment of natural resources and industry Instead of big navies they could build fa trade with each other, promoting their own welfare and easing their own tax burdens without adding to the jealousies and rival-ries-that now handlean all alike. But all that is looking far into the future.

BRITAIN EXPANDS

The meek not only inherit the earth, but hang onto it, Great Britain is planning a ple-bisoite in Kenya (British East Africa) and Tanganyika (German East Africa, now held by Britain under a mandate), to determine whether they shall be joined under the British Crown. They would make a Union of East Africa corresponding to the Union of South

Kenva of course is willing. The German inhabitants of Tanganyika would prefer to have that region revert to Germany. But they are only a handful in a native populaseveral millions. Britain is not_inclined to give back any mandated territory. particularly a choice morsel larger than Germany, rich in gold and other minerals. 


