TVA'S FATE RESTS IN HANDS OF COURT

Four Cases Affecting New Deal Legislation Now Awaiting Decision

WASHINGTON, Dec. 20 (AP) - The TVA experiment was tested in the legal life of the administration today as the supreme court today as still heard four new cases involving the Guffey coal sale...

Four cases affecting new deal legislation now are awaiting decision, possibly as early as January 10. The cases involve the original and amended AAA act and the Bankhead cotton production control law.

Speaking for the government, Solicitor General Stanley Reed had earlier TVA has a proper exercise of federal power. He said nothing was involved in the case except the validity of a contract for sale of transmission lines by the Alabama Power company to TVA and for an exchange of power.

The Guffey coal act, designed to establish a little NRA in the soft coal industry, was brought before the court in petitions by both the government and the Carter Coal company of West Virginia. They asked the justices to pass on a ruling by the District of Columbia supreme court which held price fixing unconstitutional but voided sections regulating wages and hours.

The lower court also granted the Carter company an injunction against paying a tax of more than 15 per cent of the sale price at the mines. The act imposed a 16 per cent tax of which 50 per cent will be refunded to those who aided by its provisions.

Split Opinion Looms The TVA suit was brought by 14 chapter in our history and "prevents a case of administrative mal-evalence beyond anything ever anticipated by anyone."

They said that if the primary purpose of the act was to aid navigation the law was valid, but if it was to develop and sell power it was invalid. He contended the government could sell power produced as an incident to its efforts to aid navigation.

NAVAL CONFERENCE OBSERVES HOLIDAY

Some Observers See Slight Weakening in Japanese Demands

LONDON, Dec. 20 (AP) - The international naval conference adjourned today until January 5 without an agreement, but some authoritative observers expected they discerned a slight weakening in Japanese demands for equality with Great Britain and the United States.

This view was not shared by all delegations and the Japanese representatives returned to the press that they just have their equality.

Continues Criticism Admiral Isoroku Yamamoto, chief of the Japanese delegation, continued his critical analysis of the British scheme but, it is understood, has not rejected the proposal definitely.

The Japanese indicated they still willing to discuss whatever details the British may bring up in January. However, the orientals still feel the proposals generally are unworkable, claiming that they would require a continuation of the present ratio system - mean that Japan the parity also demands.
