EMPLOYMENT SECURITY

A new form of economic security for A new form of economic security for wage-carners is reported by the General Electric Company. About five thousand employees in an Ohio incandescent Imap plant have been guaranteed at least twelve hundred hours of work or pay for next year.

This is better than the usual form of un-employment insurance, because it is done voluntarily by the employing company itself, and because it is a positive measure, trying to keep workers profitably busy instead of merely compensating them when they lose their jobs.

Here is an interesting angle to it. The General Electric announcement says: "Employees in New York are excluded from the benefits of this plan, because Ohlo has made provision in its unemployment law, as have some other states, to grant tax reductions to employers who guarantee employment." Such a state policy offers a shrewd induce-

ment to private enterprise to establish such guarantees. The state doing this doubtless stands to gain in the long run.

STUDENT PATRIOTS

As the Japanese militarists slowly proceed with their occupancy of North China they are opposed not by troops, but by students. This phase of the historic process now under way in eastern Asia must interest our own young people.

On December seventeenth there was night of fierce rioting against Japanese ag-gression in the ancient city of Pelping. (The first riots there may have occurred a mil-lion years ago, when the children of the "Peiping Man" were fighting over a marresping sum were tigating over a mar-rowbone; but let that pass.) Sixty student-patriots were wounded. The students forced postponement of the inaugural meeting of General Sung Cheh Yuan's "semi-autonomous council for Hopeh and Chahar Prov-inces." The General declared wrathfully that he would expel two American-educated university professors.


