The United States leads the civilized v in violent deaths by homicide and fatal acci-This is not merely in the total number f deaths, but in the rates per unit of popu-

The national accident mortality rate, for example, is almost twice that of England, Wales, or Germany and more than twice that of Italy, Sweden or Belgium.

The homicide rate here is eighteen times

that of England and Wales, and twenty-nine times that of the Netherlands.

In suicides, the United States holds a mid-

dle position among the world's nations

Perhaps the fatal accidents are more numerous here because of the higher speed at which we live, and the higher proportion of the people engaged in hazardous occupations. It should not be forgotten, however, that most fatal accidents occur on the highways, with home accidents next.

The high homicide rate is hard to explain It reflects, says an insurance company bil-letin, "a rather general indifference to hu-man values." Why Americans are more callous in this respect remains unexplained.

BEANS ON WHEELS

The intest innovation of Henry Ford is a factory to make automobiles out of soy beans. This may sound like a joke, but isn't,

The new factory is nearing completion at River, Rouge, Michigan. It is costing about five million dollars, and is meant to turn soy beans into plastic materials that will be made into automobile parts. There are vast storage tanks, mixers, presses and molds. The molding plant alone is as big as two city blocks. There will be a capacity for more

than one-hundred thousand anto parts a day. It will not be possible, of course, to make an entire automobile from these bean plastics. But they might constitute most of the auto except the motor and other parts subject to great strain. Such substances are light, dur-

able, non-corrosive, and fairly strong.
Mr. Ford, however, is interested in more
than merely providing a new automotive material. He has long urged greater utiliza-tion of farm products for industrial purposes, with more cooperation between country and city. His new plant will be the largest factory in the world for the industrial process-ing of farm crops, and if successful will set an important example to American industry,
