

DRIVING INTELLIGENCE

Professor Amos E. Neyhart of State College, Pennsylvania, has a theory that 65 per cent of motor vehicle fatalities are attribut-able to "poor driving habits" and that drivers tend to continue the driving practices—good or had—of their teachers. He believes, therefore, that instructing a beginner in good driving habits will make him a safe driver.

Professor Neyhart conducts a driving course for students of State College High School In order to be eligible, students must meet the state's requirements for learners permits. His first class of students, taught as individuals, obtained drivers' licenses three years ago. In the time since then not one of that group has ever been involved in an au-tomobile crash or mishap. His second class has been driving for two years. There were and to date they have a perfect safety score.

At the same time, the professor is conduct ing other experiments. He has found lack of "depth perception" to be the cause of many collisions. The driver is upable to judge the eed of oncoming cars with relation to other traffic. If this lack can be discovered and minimized.

The resignation of James G. McDonald American, commissioner for the League of Nations in bohalf of German refugees, helps to bring the Jewish persecution problem to a head. The position of the Jews in Germany, he says, starved as they are and deprived of all economic security; humilinted and discrimininated against in countless ways, is "a chal-lenge to the conscience of mankind," a threat to international peace and a source of injury

"My experiences convince me that nothing less is involved in this tragedy than principles basic to civilization itself. Half a rillion people are having their lives crushed out, with no charges brought agrainst them except that they are not what the National Socialists choose to regard as Nordic. The growing sufferings of this presented miss. ing sufferings of this persecuted minority in Germany and the menace of the growing exodus calls for friendly but Irm Interession, by all pacific means, on the part of the League of Nations, its nember states and other members of he community of nations."

This persecution seems partly based on an obsession in the mind of Hitler, a poorly educated man full of whims and prejudices, and partly on political strategy. The "Aryan" question is largely a "red herring" dragged across the Irall to divert people's minds from wn troubles and the government's de fects. Its basic philosophy is so unsound and its human effects are so cruel that surely some concerted effort should be made by the world to make the German majority

realize what they are doing. The League of Nations is the logical in strument for this purpose. It should be abl to handle such race-persecution as boldly as it has handled the Ethiopian problem. If ig-nored, the situation will lead to more trouble in Europe not merely for the Jewish race but for other minority races.




