

There is at least one point about Alfred
B: Smith's Saturday night speech which has
a good deal to commend it. Mr. Smith made
his position so plain with respect to the New Deal that any misunderstanding of his view is impossible.

Mr. Smith refuses to accept the Roosevelt

mr. Smith retuses to accept the troosevert philosophy in any way, shape or form, chiefly it would seem on the broad ground that it is not representative of the principles of Democracy as laid down by Jefferson, the son and Gleveland. No sounder or better plat-form than that upon which President Roosevelt ran for the Presidency was ever pro-mulgated by the Democratic party, yet the policy of the men in charge of the party destiny is more Socialistic than Democratic he declares

There are many who will cry sour grapes and hasten to point out that in the emergency following the Roosevelt inauguration there was justification and to spare for the shange in program. But that the pro-gram was changed few will deny and, whether it was justified or not it is difficult to get away from the fact that many of the official acts of the President and Congress are clearly pledged in the platform of Nor-man Thomas, Socialist candidate for Presi dent three years ago, while a program al-together-different in its essentials was just as clearly pledged in the Democratic plat-

But when Mr. Smith goes to the length of declaring that a choice must be made as to whether the capital of the Nation shall be Washington, D. C., or Moscow, Russia, he is indulging in what amounts to pure claptrap and his address gains no added strength be-cause of it. Al Smith is or at least was a power in the counsels of the Democratic party and as such his views are entitled to more than ordinary consideration. But "it should not have been necessary to step quite so far out-of the record. The precepts and principles of Socialism may yet rule the country but we

haven't got them yet notwithstanding the fact that we are apprecially closer to such a goal than we were three years ago.


