### INSANITY IN COURT

Idaho has plenty of laws upon her statute books but there is one more which should be

As an aid to the cause of fustice Idaho about follow the lead of a number of East-ern States and set up the necessary machin-ery for an examination as to the sanity of persons accused of capital crime at the hands of a Commission appointed for the purpose, the examination to take place, not during the trial but in advance of it.

The question of the sanity or insanity of

an accused would then be settled in a man ner which would leave less doubt in the minds of a good many persons than is now apt to ing. As matters are now conducted determination as to sanity is based upon the views of a certain number of authorities whose or a certain number of authorities whose services are paid for by the State and a sim-llar group who are paid by counsel for the defense. Each, side testifies as it is hired to testify and the jury is asked to determine

endure which hardly makes for exact justice.

An impartial Commission of disinterested men to be composed of both experts and nonexperts would function much as does a trial judge. In the event of a vordict of insanity no further trial would be necessary, merely mitment to an insane asylum. If an ac cused were found to be perfectly sano case could go to trial on its merits with the entire question of sanity or inated from the proceedings. of sanity or insanity elim

It is a question if such procedure could be introduced into Idaho laws merely by Legis-lative enactment. There is a possibility that such a change would require an amendment to the Idaho Constitution. But it would prob-ably be a very good thing.

Cormack "military disaffection" bills.

-The first of these is a federal-met similar to the "criminal syndicalism" enacted by a number of state legislatures during the World War hysteria. The second provides punishment for "exerting mutinous influence on the Army and Navy."

Both might be subject to serious misuse

against fundamental rights and liberties.

They may be potentially more dangerous than the influences they propose to curb. They could easily be interpreted and en-forced to hamper freedom of speech and press and to suppress legitimate criticism of the administration of the Army or the Navy.


