George Wilson Says U. Of W. Promised \$10,500 For Playing

Athlete Explodes Football Bombshell By Asserting School Made Cash Offer For Rose Bowl Appearance

OAKLAND, Calif., Feb. 6 (P)—Wrestler George Wilson exploded a football bombshell today by declaring he was promised but had not been paid \$10,500 for playing with University of Washington in the 1928 Rose Bowl game against Alabama.

A former Washington graduate manager ridiculed Wilson's charges as "post-college dream."

The husky ball carrier, whose gridiron feats in 1925 earned him all-America honors, said he had received an offer of \$8,500 a game to play three professional engagements immediately after the regular season of that year ended.

Consequently, he said, in a vote of the players whether to accept the Rose Bowl invitation he had gone on record as opposing it.

Part of Receipts Promised

"Immediately after" Wilson declared, "officials of the university approached me and assured me that I would receive my share of the receipts."

"I never got it but I guess it was a post-college dream," he said. "I would have collected first prize if I had."

Wilson was the game 20-16.

Asked why he had withheld the allegations for a decade, Wilson said he had let slip the information last night during a discussion with an Oakland newspaperman on the ethics of collegiate football as compared to the professional variety.

In Seattle, Edwin McDermott, graduate manager at Washington when Wilson attended, ridiculed the allegations, saying "a good friend George Wilson must be having a post-college dream... too inconceivable to be taken seriously."
