## Social Security Act Seeks To Relieve Workers' Worries

Mayola. That will start the fund for the old age benefits.

Both unemployment taxes and old age benefits will graduate after 1949 until they reach three and one-half per cent. By 1949 all employers of 20 or more persons will be paying one-half per cent on their payroll; three for old age benefits, and one for unemployment compensation. It will look something like this:

Employer: John Doe	
Laundry: 1000 X street	
Number of employees	20
Total annual wages	\$24,000
Tax due for unemployment	1.200
Unemployment compensation (tax)	1.080
Tax due for old age benefits (tax)	1.200
Total tax due	\$3.480

Meanwhile John Doe's workers will make a tax return that will look something like this in 1949:

Employer: Robert Roe	
Laundry: 1000 X street	
Number of employees	20
Total annual wages	\$24,000
Tax due for unemployment	1.200
Tax due for old age benefits (tax)	1.200
Total tax due	\$2.400

If John's laundry is in a state where the laws ask employers to pay the unemployment tax, run by the state, John will have to pay it. But John didn't so far have any deductions for their unemployment contributions without such provisions, and where it is not now. The workers' tax is usually paid by the employer. When the funds begin to pay out.

Must Be Over 65

Unemployment benefits can be paid only to persons who are over 65.
