

DEAN RECOMMENDS HUGE AIR FLEET

House Military Affairs Committee Votes for Defense Bill

WASHINGTON, March 10 (AP)—A war department request for 4,000 new fighting planes in the next five years gained new momentum today in congress.

As Europe throbbed with marching armies, the house military affairs committee voted unanimously in secret session for a bill by Chairman McNair (D-Ind.) to authorize construction of the air fleet.

The action also accompanied congressional consideration of war and navy bills which passed in their present form would send national defense funds skyward in the next fiscal year to a record-breaking \$10,000,000,000.

The 146 "revenue" supply bills provide \$39,000,000 for 665 army planes and about \$26,000,000 for 523 navy planes in the next fiscal year.

Only 777 Serviceable Planes Two special war department investigations recommended the United States should have 2,230 planes, while Assistant Secretary of War Woodring estimated the United States will have only 777 serviceable planes next July 1.

In his annual report, Secretary Ryan recommended purchase of 2,000 planes in the next five years. He estimated such a program would leave the army with 3,000 combat ships by 1941.

Salvage Crew Fails To Raise Air Liner

SALT LAKE CITY, March 10 (AP)—A crew salvaging wreckage of a giant Standard Oil of California airplane met temporarily today when a cable snapped as the water-filled craft was being hoisted from the bottom of Great Salt Lake onto a railroad trestle at Collin, Utah.

The plane was lowered to the floor of the lake for the night. Operations will be resumed tomorrow.

The plane, which disappeared with three men on board last October, was located in the lake two weeks ago. Divers and barge crews lifted the craft from the lake floor and towed it under 2 1/2 miles to the trestle railroad trestle.

The big plane was raised sufficiently today to show that it is virtually undamaged, most of water within the wings and fuselage make the task of raising the plane onto the trestle a demanding and ship-ment to California very difficult.

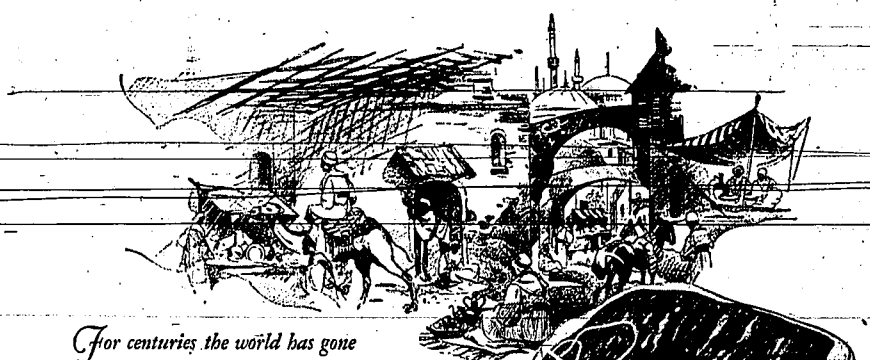

SEEDS ANSWER TO GARDEN PROBLEM

Planting Now Insures Beautiful Summer Flower Displays

While trees and shrubs form the background for every garden, we usually wait on their development over a period of years. Right now the immediate problem of home gardeners is — "What shall I plant to have a beautiful flower garden in May, June and July?" This means annuals — and there are many, many lovely things that can be planted now from seeds.

Let's imagine that you have a bright sunny border in your yard where you need something for a color, something else to show profusely in front, masses of color, and then a low blooming border to complete the picture.

For a tall background, the new Mexican marigold, the Tithonia, is very suitable. It will grow 8 to 10 feet tall if you let it, but you can control its height by cutting it back and making each plant more sturdy.

For your mass of color — plants that grow from one and a half to two feet tall — there is nothing more pleasing than the African marigold, which is just like a color carnation. If you decide on these, try the Guinea Gold or the Yellow Supreme. Then there are the tall zinnias and the charming Sunflower aster, which are always very successful. Many of us like to try something new — you enjoy seeing a new bloom unfold with which we are not acquainted. Two new blue flowers, both excellent for cutting, are available this year. First is the "Kamauia," just imported from South Africa; the other is Clintonia, which blooms profusely with wonderful clear blue spikes. It does not grow very tall and the more you cut it the more it will bloom. As a precaution against state seed, it's always well to make sure of the date on each packet.

Petunias Easy to Grow

There is no more gladdening sight than a bed of petunias. Their combination of color, form and texture immediately arrests the attention of the flower lover. They are always neat and attractive and are in great variety, from the garden sorts which are frequently grown as pot plants, as well as in the garden, including those fringed and ruffled, large flowered ones, to the single trailing or border types which may be seen growing on the hillside and along the highways, where they receive little attention.

The seeds of petunias are very small and should be sown in flats for later transplanting, mixing the seed with sand to give a better distribution. Fill flat with good loamy soil, press and smooth the surface. Broadcast the seed and cover lightly with a much of wet humus. Fine screened leaf mold or peat moss is material. Keep thoroughly moist, the seeds will germinate readily and if grown in the sunshine they will grow rapidly and develop plants in a very short time.

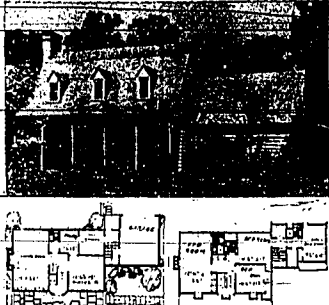

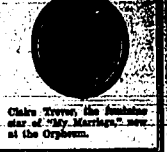
