

FILIBUSTER HINTED AS SOLONS ATTACK SHIPPING SUBSIDIES

Day at Washington Brings Two Possible Threats to Early Adjournment Aspirations of Congress

(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, March 11—Two possible threats to early adjournment aspirations of congress arose today out of the course of senate floor work.

The senate's action in rapping out of the treasury post office appropriation bill—a \$26,000,000 item for ocean mail subsidies was accompanied by a filibuster against federal aid to shipping.

A suggestion of a battle between the senate and the courts developed from a court ban on the senate's lobby committee's attempt to acquire telegrams by blanket subpoena.

The \$76,000,000 treasury post office appropriation bill was taken by the senate and sent to committee for debate on the senate floor. It had previously received a vote which struck out the \$26,000,000 item.

Edward VIII Writes In Message To Parliament For Queen To Share Throne

LONDON, March 11 (AP)—Edward VIII, the first bachelor king of England in 176 years, opened the way tonight for a queen-to-ship beside him on the British throne.

His action consisted only of a royal request to the house of commons to take account of financial provisions for a prospective queen, but it spurred speculation throughout the nation of possibility of a royal wedding.

His majesty stated that the contingency of his marriage should be taken into account so that, in that event, the queen should be able to share the throne with him.

Actually, he asked the lower house of parliament to bear in mind that his queen, if he marries, would need to be placed on the payroll.

Speculations on the significance of the monarch's communication recalled the names of five royal princesses considered "eligible" to wear the British consort's crown.

Speculatively, however, after the question of finances has been settled, the choice of a mate remains in the hands of the king, who may only by the marriage law that she must be a protestant.
