Dust Storms, Freezing Temperatures Menace West's Budding Crops

Falling Mercury Imperils California, Arizona Fruit; Snow Falls in Kansas; Sharp Winds Whisk Up Soil

ENID, Okla., March 26—A darkening dust storm billowed eastward from Oklahoma tonight as mid-winter weather nipped at the west's budding crops.

Freezing temperatures moved in on the apple, peach and pear crops of Arizona, California orchards, and in the wheat and alfalfa fields north of the Colorado river.

Snow fell in northern Kansas, holding back dust from the south. In winds blowing from the west, dust clouds of grit as far east as Kansas City and up into the Dakotas.

LAWMAKERS DONATE FOR NEEDY FAMILY

House Members Violate Own Rules—to Buy Food—and-Medicine

WASHINGTON, March 26.—Their sympathies aroused, house members violated their own rules yesterday in taking an expedition to help a Tennessee tenant farmer's family, the mother of which once was asked to leave when she nursed "Mr. Baby" in the house gallery.

Before Speaker Byrns stopped the collection \$44 had been contributed to buy food and medicine for the Everett Parkers, now living with their five children in one bare room almost within the shadow of the capitol.

Representative Dunn (D-Miss) brought the family's plight to representatives' attention and invited the mother as the one who was requested to leave last session when attendants noticed she was nursing her baby as she lay on the floor beside.

Dunn, his voice booming, told how Parker came to his office, clad in overalls and suffering from shell shock, and said he could not get a job or relief for his family.

Parker, vice president of the executive, the Mississippi related, who told him: "You are from Tennessee and you ought to be back there on the farm."

"God knows," Dunn shouted, "when I heard that I wondered how many other like executives in the city of Washington ought to be back on the farm—following a hard-luck mile."

Finds Story True
Dunn said he checked up on Parker's story that he tried everywhere to get help and found it true.

The Mississippi said the public health unit threw Parker out because he came and dared to ask that his wife be taken from a manager in the comfort of the society supposed to be civilized and there allowed to give birth to her own flesh.

The Mississippi said he finally had Mrs. Parker admitted to a hospital, but that she was sent home and had to come back later. In the meantime, the now baby came without medical attention.

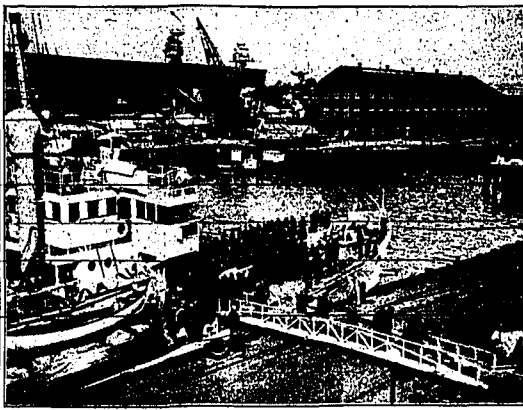
Representative Stubbs (D-Calif.) took up the collection.

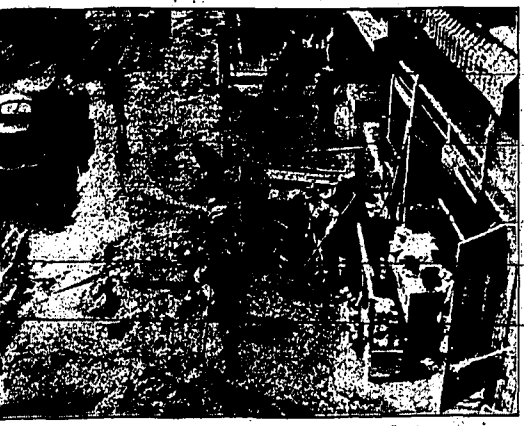
