Landon's Delegates Trail In California, Lead In South Dakota

Kansas Takes Margin in First Direct Contest With Borah; Roosevelt Overwhelms Sinclair and McGroarty Slates

Delegates pledged to the presidential candidacy of Governor Alf M. Landon trailed in California and led in South Dakota as returns in yesterday's Republican primaries in the two states began to be tallied. In California, Landon delegates pledged without the endorsement of Landon—trailed an unopposed slate. In South Dakota, where the issue was more directly between Landon delegates and those for the candidacy of Senator William E. Borah, Landon delegates accumulated a lead.

Roosevelt in Lead In California's Democratic Primary Votes

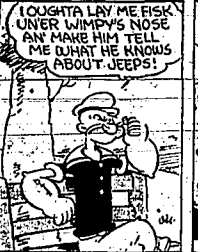

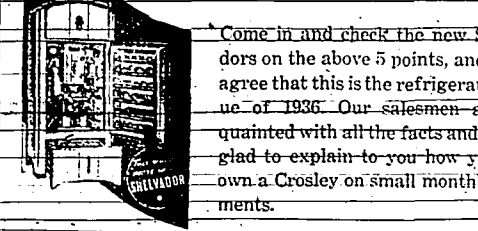

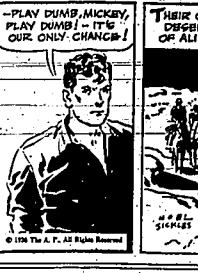
