May Luncheon Dishes

Small wonder that May is such a popular month for luncheons, when there are so many new dishes to be tried; when the garden yields their loveliest pastels for decorations, and when the markets afford such quantities of fresh fruits and vegetables for varied menus.

By this time of the season, strawberry shortcakes are no novelty, but have you considered strawberries in salad form? Out one pint of strawberries, wash and stem, combine with one medium can of pineapple dressing, and serve over small rounds of cottage cheese in nests of crisp lettuce. Pass mayonnaise or French dressing.

Asparagus—May basket is a crown and Crabbed salad, slice the top from a firm tomato, scoop out center—stuff with trimmings of mayonnaise, inside the opening, slip asparagus, slice standing in a cork-like circle. Serve in lettuce nests.

2 cup grated Parmesan cheese.

Shortcakes Show Blush of Spring

Aside from spring flowers, balmy breezes and new clothes, one of the most delightful of this season is most Americans a strawberry shortcake, a dish as nationally distinctive as pumpkin pie. Springs may come and simple shortcakes will spring without strawberry shortcake would hardly be worth recollecting to large numbers of citizens in all parts of the country.

All unassuming, the consumer of strawberry shortcake, concerned only with its simple deliciousness and satisfying reputation, is doing his nutritive system a good turn, for the wheat in the shortcake is an energy food, while the strawberry is one of our rich sources of Vitamin-C, as well as several mineral salts particularly beneficial at this time of the year.

There are, of course, shortcakes and shortcakes varying in flavor and texture from the plain unsweetened hot-biscuit type to sweet-cake mixtures. At the opening of the strawberry season, it is a good idea to present one type after another to your family and then steady down to the formula which seems to be unanimously acceptable.

- Plain Biscuit Shortcake**
2 cups flour
4 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
6 tablespoons shortening
1/2 cup milk
1 quart strawberries
Sift the flour, measure and sift again with the baking powder and salt. Cut in the shortening to the texture of coarse meal. Add the milk and form a soft dough. Knead gently for a few minutes. Pat or roll out about 1/2 inch thick. Fit half the dough into a 9-inch cake pan. Brush lightly with melted butter. Place remaining dough over the top. Bake in hot oven (425 degrees F.) 10 to 12 minutes.
- Crush half the berries and sweeten to taste. Save top or use as a topping. Split the shortcake horizontally and fill with the prepared berries. Mix powdered sugar with the juice to a spreading consistency. Frost top layer of shortcake. Place whole berries on top and serve with or without cream.

- Waffle Cake Foundation**
2 eggs, separated
1 1/2 cups milk
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 tablespoon sugar
2 cups flour
3 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
8 tablespoons melted shortening
1 quart strawberries
Beat yolks, milk and vanilla together. Sift flour, baking powder, sugar and salt together. Add to liquid and blend. Add melted shortening and stiffly beaten egg whites. Bake on hot waffle iron. Spread crushed, sweetened berries on top of each section, or between two sections. Top with whipped cream for individual serving.

VEGETABLE CUP VOGUE

Vegetable cups are having their inning these days as popular food garnishes. Green peppers, large onions, firm tomatoes, turnips or large carrots may be used as cups to hold mixtures of rice, meat or fish and sauce. To prepare for stuffing:

Wash and hollow out the peppers, parboil.
The onions, and carrots, too,

should be cooked whole then cut hollowed-in-cup-shape.
Tomatoes need no preliminary cooking. Cut off stem and hollow out.

- Rich Strawberry Shortcake**
2 cups flour
1/2 cup sugar
4 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
Few grains nutmeg
1 egg
1-2 cup shortening
1-3 cup milk
1 quart strawberries
Mix dry ingredients and sift twice. Mix dry ingredients and stiff twice. Add egg well beaten and milk. Toast on floured board, roll, divide in two parts. Fit one part into cake tin, brush with butter, add second layer—bake-in-hot-oven—(425—degrees F.) 12 to 15 minutes. Split with strawberries, crushed and sweetened with powdered sugar. Top with strawberries and whipped cream.

- STUFFED TURNIP CUPS**
1 cup cooked rice
1 cup cold ham (or any other left-over meat)
1 tablespoon minced parsley
8 turnips, uniform size
1 tablespoon butter
1 minced onion (small)
1/2 teaspoon curry powder
Salt and pepper
- Fare the turnips, cut a slice from the top and scoop out the inside, leaving a rim one-fourth inch. Cook both shells and cover for fifteen minutes in boiling salt water; then arrange them in a baking pan, fill with the minced meat, rice and seasoning; cover with tops, fastening each with a tooth pick. Pour around them the water in which the turnips shells were cooked and bake until tender. Pour off the liquid and brown lightly. Serve. Pour over the liquid at the moment when taken to table. The portions scooped out may be used for mashed or creamed turnips. Cook 20 minutes at a temperature of 350 degrees. This recipe serves eight.
