GOODING TO REMEDY GARBAGE SITUATION

GOODING, May 11 — Disposal of garbage and the proper container for it have been discussed by the city council recently with the action being taken by City Marshal Troy Cox, who announces specifications for garbage cans.

The containers must be of 15-gallon capacity, equipped with tight fitting lid and two handles, and be made of sheet metal. For other than dwellings a 30-gallon can must be provided. Anyone depositing garbage in any other kind of a container will be guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a \$25 fine. The city provides a truck for the free collection and disposition of garbage.
